**Guaranteed departures** – departure dates on each itinerary shown as bold are guaranteed departure dates. All other departures operate with a minimum of 4 clients.

So when planning the Sunway routes we ensure that each trip provides the best inclusions and experiences. For example, if you go to Botswana – you have to visit the national parks in an open 4WD – it is the essence of the Botswana wilderness. If you tour Zambia, then you must visit South Luangwa NP and do a game walk with a local scout.

When booking on a Sunway safari there are no hidden costs. All of the entrance fees are included, and a wide range of activities, and most meals. We have included many highlights in our tours, so that you will see and experience the highlights without having to pay extra when you get there. So when you decide on which safari company to book with, look carefully at what you're actually getting. You may only visit a place once, make sure you get the most out of it.

**Safety** – our fleet of vehicles are custom built to ensure comfortable and safe touring. Each is constructed, by an authorised passenger vehicle builder, to the latest safety requirements, with a safety shell, and every seat has a lap belt. ## CLASSIC JOURNEYS

**Authentic wildlife, adventure travel in comfort and style. Keeping in line with our popular small group concept, we will take you to the highlights of the countries travelled while keeping you off the beaten track, and stay in some of the most fantastic private lodges in Southern Africa. G&T anyone?**

Our Classic Journeys are adventure travel and offer the same quality service that Sunway is renowned for, but with a higher standard of accommodation and a little more comfort.

The accommodation we use is the "classic" Southern African style, using 3+ star lodges, tented camps, and guest houses. We have chosen lodges, based on their location, that pay attention to detail and are intimate with a casual and relaxed atmosphere. All rooms will be en-suite. In some cases we'll be staying inside the national parks, but on other nights we prefer to overnight at private lodges. The concept is to provide the best possible experience for you the traveller.



CLASSIC - indicates en-suite lodge rooms, Classic Journey style.

Most **meals will be catered in-house by the guest houses, lodges and camps** allowing you to enjoy buffet style breakfasts and casual dinners with your travelling companions around the lodge dinner table. On some travelling days you will have roadside picnics with lunches catered by your versatile guide. There will also be some own expense meals which are detailed in the itinerary. (Please also refer to the safari grade section on each page.)

Classic Journeys are a relaxed holiday experience, allowing you to sit back and soak it all in. Africa has a special way of touching your soul.

**Classic Journeys are non-participation style** meaning staff will prepare and tidy up meals.



## ACCOMMODATED ADVENTURES

**If travelling to Africa has always been your dream then our range of accommodated adventures offer interesting, varied and exciting journeys that will get you closer to Africa's nature and her people. Using comfortable, simple and well located accommodation, our small group safaris offer fantastic value for money combined with Sunway Safaris quality service.**

Accommodated Adventures are based on our proven small group adventure safaris concept, you will overnight in guest houses, chalets, lodges or permanent tented camps. The accommodation we use is generally graded 2 to 3 star and is comfortable, clean and friendly and is booked on a twin share basis. The majority of rooms have en-suite bathrooms and very occasionally they will have shared ablutions. All linen and bedding is provided.



COMFORT - indicates en-suite rooms in a lodge or guest house.



RUSTIC - indicates where rooms either share a bathroom, or where the accommodation available is more basic.

On certain of the itineraries we visit the Okavango Delta with 2 nights at a mobile tented camp. Each dome tent has twin camp beds with linen and en-suite chemical toilet. Shared bucket shower tent with hot water off the fire.

Most **meals will be prepared by the Sunway guides**, from the truck. Evening meals we eat around a camp fire or in a boma and you will have roadside picnic style lunches on travelling days. Depending on the itinerary a selection of dinners and breakfasts will be catered in-house by certain lodges.

With professional Sunway guides to lead our safari and a comfortable bed to sleep in every night you are assured of a fantastic holiday. You will not find a better value for money safari.

## UNDER CANVAS CAMPING

**Camping in the wilds of Africa is the way to go – it's an awesome experience to lie in your tent at night listening to the roar of lions or the haunting cry of a jackal!**

On safari you stay in designated camping sites in national parks, private reserves, private campsites and towns. Facilities are good with hot showers, electricity, clothes washing facilities and generally a bar and restaurant available. Some camps further north can be basic and have limited facilities and simple reed enclosures for showers but do have flush toilets!

In the Botswana national parks we generally use private wild campsites. On wild camping nights there are no facilities. The Sunway team will erect a bucket shower, with warm water from the fire, and a pit toilet tent. Wild camping is a true wilderness experience and we keep our impact on the environment to a minimum, taking out everything we take in.



Sunway supplies all the camping equipment with the exception of your sleeping bag and pillow (available for rent). The canvas dome tents we use are large (2.2 x 2.2 x 1.8 metre), with built-in insect nets. Putting them up or down takes only 5 minutes. We supply 5 cm thick mattresses, which are warm and comfortable. The camp chairs have a backrest and all cooking and eating utensils will also be provided. Food is kept in sealed containers and cooler boxes or freezers ensuring fresh and hygienic food preparation.



It's not all camping! On most safaris there will be a number of lodge or guest house accommodation nights. The facilities will be modest but clean and comfortable. Generally you will have an en-suite twin room.

Most **meals will be prepared by the Sunway guides**, evening meals we eat around a camp fire or in a boma and you will have roadside picnic style lunches on travelling days.

**Under Canvas Camping safaris are limited participation.**

## Repeat discount

There is a **5% discount** available to repeat clients, so if you have travelled with Sunway before and are considering another Sunway safari, remember to tell your original booking agent when you book again.

## OUR FLEET OF SAFARI VEHICLES

**The journeys we offer are vehicle based and you're going to spend time on the road exploring Southern Africa. It's therefore important that our vehicles are built for purpose.**

**We have a comprehensive fleet of both custom designed safari trucks and four wheel drive game viewing vehicles. We are dedicated to ensuring the designs of our vehicles are suited to our tours and we are proud to present a reliable and well maintained fleet, ideal for Africa travel.**

### Trucks

Our trucks are custom built and tailored to the needs of our small group tours. We have ensured that space is maximised so they are comfortable and have ample leg room. We are completely self-sufficient on safari and the trucks have large passenger windows and front windows to guarantee great visibility and unobstructed photography.

### 4WDs

In the national parks of Botswana we will make use of our open 4WD game viewing vehicles which offer unobstructed views and the best possible game viewing experience. Our 4WDs (12+2 seater) are built to the latest safety standards with a built in safety shell and individual bucket seats with lap belts. Game viewing from these vehicles is extraordinary because with the sides rolled up, you feel part of the bush and incredibly close to the wildlife.

### Buses

Where road conditions allow, such as South Africa, Namibia and parts of Botswana we may also use buses.

### Safety

All of our vehicles (trucks, 4wds and buses) are bought new and serviced by Toyota and Mercedes agents. This ensures trouble free touring with back-up support in practically every town in Southern Africa.

Our Sunway trucks are built to conform to the latest safety regulations. Each vehicle is fitted with a safety shell and each seat has a lap belt. The Sunway trucks are built by a registered coach builder and we have a specific homologation design certificate.

**Classic Journeys single supplement:** Due to the group size and the lodge room allocations, if you are travelling on your own there is a price supplement. Please see the individual itineraries for details of the single supplement.

**Non-participation:** On the Classic Journeys the Sunway team, and the various accommodation staff will look after the operational side of the safari. Your holiday time is exclusively yours to enjoy your safari and get the most from your travel experience. Where porters are available they'll help with your bags, but sometimes you'll need to carry your own bags. Please remember that this is still an adventure tour, travelling by vehicle, so the more you put in the more rewarding your experience will be.

**Classic Journey transport:** In Botswana on the Botswana Baobabs Classic Journey, we use open sided custom built 4WD vehicles, maximum of 8 clients, each having their own 'window' seat. On the Zimbabwe and Botswana Ivory Route Classic Journey, we use primarily minibuses, with air conditioning, for transfers between destinations, and then make use of local open game drive vehicles where possible. And on the Namibia and Botswana Elephant Track, due to road conditions, we use primarily a Sunway safari truck.



**Note Classic Journey luxury mobile camp:** For 2 nights in Savuti in the Chobe NP, we stay in a luxury pre-erected mobile tented camp. Each mini Meru tent has camp beds with linen, bed side table, solar powered lighting, and an en suite bath room with private shower. The camp is serviced by our back up team, including housekeeping, waiter and chef. Set up on private exclusive use locations within the national park the camp is a wonderful experience and highlight for many clients.

## MAKUWA SAFARI LODGE

Makuwa Safari Lodge is located in the Greater Kruger National Park, near the town of Hoedspruit. Makuwa is an ideal bush base from which to access the Kruger through the Orpen gate.

Settle into your bush experience with an evening sundowner as the sun sets over the Drakensberg Mountains before enjoying a scrumptious meal prepared by our friendly staff. The following days can be spent exploring Kruger NP as a self-drive, or in an open safari vehicle with the Makuwa guides. We also offer guided bush walks in the neighbouring big 5 reserve, where your armed safari guide will show you the fascinating details of the African bushveld.

The lodge comprises 3 white-washed thatch houses with airy covered patios overlooking lush buffalo grass lawns dotted with acacias, fever trees, and a massive fig tree.

Beyond the lawns is the lodge's private reserve, home to buffalo, zebra, nyala, kudu and other plains game...with the occasional leopard and wild dog in the vicinity. Self drive visitors and groups welcome.

**Accommodated Adventures single supplements:** Booking solo - you do not pay any more for travelling as a single person. If you are travelling on your own, Sunway will automatically room you with another same gender single person. If however you request a single room these are available on each tour, with a price supplement. Please note that there is a limit of 2 single rooms available on each tour.

**Limited participation:** On our accommodated adventures we will require a limited amount of participation from you. The Sunway guides will, when required, do the meal preparation and will ask you for a bit of help cleaning up afterwards (on rotation). Where restaurant meals are included in the itinerary, obviously these will be served by the lodge and do not require your assistance. When everyone gets involved in the safari it makes the entire tour more successful.



**Note Accommodated Adventures Okavango Delta:**

For 2 nights in the Okavango Delta on Accommodated Adventures, we stay in a simple pre-erected mobile tented camp. Each dome tent has camp stretchers with linen, and an en-suite chemical toilet.

There is a communal bucket shower with hot water off the fire. We are hosted by the local community guides.

## ZULULAND LODGE

Zululand Lodge is situated on the Msinene Conservancy in northern KwaZulu Natal, 20km north of Hluhluwe town. Our intimate comfortable lodge offers a private African bush experience.

Accommodation consists of nine well-appointed permanent tents, with en suite bathrooms, and secluded decks to enjoy the surrounding bushveld.

Spend a relaxing afternoon in our lounge watching the zebra drinking at the waterhole. Enjoy a sundowner drink from our raised bar which offers expansive views over the wilderness. Delicious breakfasts and evening meals prepared by our chef, are served in our dining area.

Game walks through the riverine forest along the banks of the Msinene River offer amazing birding opportunities as well as hippo, crocodile, nyala and possible sightings of the elusive resident leopards. We are perfectly located to visit Hluhluwe NP, Mkhuze GR and Lake St Lucia, iSimangaliso Wetland Park.

If however you request a single tent, a limited number of these are available on each camping tour, with a price supplement.

**Limited participation:** On our camping safaris we will require some participation during the tour. This includes putting up and taking down your tent (your trusty guides are never too far away to lend a helping hand), packing and unpacking the vehicle and some help with the meals on the tour. The guides do all of the provisioning, meal planning and cooking, but a bit of help with preparation before and cleaning up after the meal is always appreciated.

**Note:** Southern Africa has an excellent climate throughout the year, and campsite facilities throughout the region are very good. The outdoor holiday lifestyle is very popular. Campsites provide running water, hot showers, electrical power points, in great locations with helpful staff.

Specifically in Botswana, we make use of operator only private and exclusive campsites. These campsites are located inside the national parks of Botswana, and allow us to get an incredibly close wilderness experience. Our guides will ensure that wild camping is a fantastic part of your safari.

# RESPONSIBLE TRAVEL

**Sunway is acutely aware of the need to reduce our impact on the environment and operate sustainably; thereby supporting the protection of ecosystems and the rural communities of Southern Africa. Sunway's environmental policy applies to everyone travelling with us and allows us to experience the lands we are visiting but also have a positive influence on the communities and ultimately the natural environment.**

Sustainable tourism practices, financial benefits to conservation and goodwill are all factors that Sunway aims to balance at all times. We firmly believe that sustainable utilisation is the only viable conservation approach in Africa, and our small group style of travel is the ideal driver for long term conservation in Southern Africa.

### **Employment of Local Guides: Enhancing Experiences and Community Benefits**

Local people possess exceptional knowledge about the wildlife and the areas they call home. We prioritize the employment of local guides and by doing so, we ensure that the communities we visit receive direct revenues from our visits. Many of the people that we employ, both directly and indirectly, are the sole bread winners in their families.

### **Supporting Rural Communities**

Sunway tours visit remote rural areas. By visiting these places, and using local accommodation and services, we are bringing financial benefits to these communities which is the very essence of responsible tourism.

### **Entrance Fees: Supporting National Parks and Community Conservation**

All entrance fees spent on tour contribute to national parks maintenance and community conservation efforts. We endeavour to support community run projects which ensure the preservation of these natural resources through community ownership, employment and pride.

### **Good2Go campaign**

Our Good2Go campaign showcases the lodges we use on tour and their commitment to conservation and local communities. When you book a Sunway trip, you directly contribute to the local economy and various conservation initiatives. This we believe is the key to the fundamental benefit of tourism. More about our Good2Go campaign is highlighted on each detailed itinerary which can be downloaded from our website.



### **Water and plastic**

We encourage you to make use of a water bottle and refill it from taps and boreholes on tour. The water quality is good. Avoid buying single use plastic bottles and your guides can advise on where to refill.

### **Carbon Emissions - Benefits of Small Group Touring**

Small group travel is a more environmentally friendly option than self-drive because the carbon emissions per person is significantly lower. 2 people in a self-drive 4WD use approximately 6-7 litres of fuel per person per 100km whereas 10 people in a Sunway truck use less than 2 litres of fuel per person per 100km – it's more than 3x more sustainable to travel on a Sunway small group tour!

### **SOS - Save our Sausage Trees Project - Okavango**

Traditionally local communities in Botswana's Okavango Delta use the wood of the Sausage Tree (*Kigelia Africana*) to craft their mekoro. The demand for wooden mekoro is unsustainable, and sadly these trees are disappearing from the region. In response we established the SOS trees project which assists local community polers to buy replica fiberglass mekoro. These mekoro have a longer lifespan than wooden ones and are produced without negative effect on the environment. A collection box will be made available after your Okavango excursion and any donations go directly to the purchase of fiberglass mekoro. Since 2011 Sunway clients have helped over 70 polers to buy their own mekoro.

Since Maun's founding in 1915 as the capital of the Batswana people, it has had a reputation as a hard-living "Wild West" town helping the local cattle ranching and safari operations. The name Maun is derived from the San word 'maung', which translates as 'the place of short reeds'.

### Day 3 - 4 OKAVANGO DELTA [tented camp x 2 BLD]


 We drive into the Okavango Delta to the launch station where we board our mekoro's and pole to our tented camp in the heart of the largest inland delta in the world. This amazing environment has large numbers of red lechwe, buffalo, elephant and birds, particularly kingfishers! One of the best experiences in the Okavango Delta is to be poled along reed-lined channels in a mokoro (dug-out canoe). Sit back and relax as the water gurgles gently under the mokoro while your skilled poler points out the fauna and flora.

### Day 5, 6, 7, 8 MOREMI


**[3x tented bush camp BLD, 1x lodge BL -]** 

We take an open 4WD into Moremi Game Reserve for fantastic game viewing! Chief's Island is the largest landmass within Moremi and was the Batswana tribe's richest hunting ground, before being declared a game reserve by the tribe. We spend 4 days on game drives watching the abundant wildlife including elephant, hippo, buffalo, lion & other game, both in Moremi Game Reserve and in private concession reserves surrounding the park. We return to Maun midday on day 8 for an evening restaurant meal (own expense).

### Day 9 MAKGADIKGADI PANS [tented lodge or chalets BL -]

 We have time for an optional game flight over the Okavango (own expense) before we head to Nata. The shimmering salt pans of Makgadikgadi appear as a glaring white, endless plain. When the rain comes a dramatic change takes place as thousands of wildebeest and zebra migrate to the sweet nutritious grasslands and clouds of flamingo feed in its algae rich waters. ## SAFARI GRADE: ACCOMMODATED

In this 21-day trip, we've lassoed all the highlights of Namibia and Botswana together, from Namibia's famous Sossusvlei dunes to Botswana's epic game reserves. Soak up Victoria Falls before crossing into arid Namibia's Etosha National Park. Climb the Namib Desert dunes, then bush walk in Botswana with the San bushmen. Dug-out canoes take you deep into the Okavango Delta, and a cruise caps things off in Chobe National Park. The same itinerary is offered as a camping option, see page 42.

**NBa21 Livingstone to Livingstone** is the full circular route.

**NBa15 Livingstone to Windhoek** offers northern Namibia with a Victoria Falls start. See page 18.

**Overnight** 18 nights on safari at small lodges (including tented lodges), with en suite facilities.

2 nights tented camp in the Okavango. Each tent has twin camp beds with linen and en suite chemical toilet. Shared bucket shower tent with hot water off the fire.

**Meals** 20 breakfasts, 17 lunches & 11 dinners included. Of which 9 breakfasts are provided by the lodges. The remaining included meals are provided by Sunway crew and meals will be enjoyed around the campfire at the truck.

**Transport** for the majority of this safari you travel in custom-built Sunway Safari trucks with 12 forward facing seats. On 5% of tours we may use Mercedes Sprinter minibuses with 12 forward facing seats and air conditioning.

There are some long distances to cover and a few early morning starts. For the transfer to the Okavango, we use open-sided 4WD vehicles with local guides.

**Limited participation** An essential part of your safari is some participation. From carrying your own bag to packing the truck in the morning – it's all part of your adventure. Where the tour leaders provide meals we ask that clients help (on rotation) with the washing up.

**Day 1 - 2 LIVINGSTONE [chalet Bx1--]**   
(B=breakfast, L=lunch, D=dinner)  
Tour departure meeting at 14:00pm. Victoria Falls is one of the natural wonders of the world and we take 2 days to explore this area. Adventure activities abound, white water rafting on the mighty Zambezi, helicopter flights or an 111m bungee jump (own expense).

**Day 3 - 4 CAPRIVI [chalet BLD]**   
Crossing out of Zambia into the Caprivi strip, we spend two days travelling west through this game rich area. We'll explore the Kwando River by boat and a game drive into the Mahango Game Reserve.

**Day 5 RUNDU [chalet BL-]**   
After a morning enjoying the abundant birdlife that surrounds the camp, our road takes us along the Kavango River. Villages of grass huts and local wooden crafts and carvings are a common sight. We stop for the night at our riverside lodge in Rundu and enjoy a spectacular sunset.

**Day 6, 7 - 8 ETOSHA NATIONAL PARK [lodge BLD]**   
We head deeper into Namibia to the Etosha National Park. The National Park surrounds the Etosha Pan, and is locally named "the great white place of dry water". Waterholes surround the pan and attract game. Etosha is known for great sightings of elephant, antelope and lions. Our lodge lies on the boundary of the park and we spend our mornings and afternoons on game drives.

**Day 9 BRANDBERG [lodge BLD]**   
Our journey covers some beautiful desert landscapes as we move south towards the Brandberg Mountain. Our lodge is situated in the dry Ugab River which is home to the rare desert elephants. We take a walk with a local guide to view the famous White Lady rock painting in the area.

**Day 10 - 11 SWAKOPMUND [guest house Bx2 Lx1 -]**   
We cross flat open plains to the coast where we visit the Cape Cross seal colony. Further south is the coastal town of Swakopmund where we have a day free to explore the town or try sea kayaking or dune boarding (own expense). German colonial influences are strong in the town of Swakopmund as reflected in the restaurant menus and the architecture.

**Day 12 - 13 NAMIB DESERT [permanent tent BLD]**   
The lunar landscapes surround the town of Swakopmund and we visit these as we leave and head into the Namib Desert with its towering red sand dunes. We will walk to Sossusvlei, explore Sesriem Canyon and from the comfort of our lodge outside the national park watch a dramatic sunset over the desert. ### Day 2 KRUGER NATIONAL PARK [tented lodge BLD]



This morning we wake early and game drive north through the park to the Pafuri region. The northern Kruger is dominated by mopane veld and is the domain of large elephant bulls, wilddog and lions. As we reach the Limpopo Valley the vegetation changes to forest and birdlife is prolific. We exit the park, late in the afternoon, and overnight at a lodge just outside the Kruger.

### Day 3 GREAT ZIMBABWE [hotel BLD]



Entering Zimbabwe at the Beit Bridge border post, we travel north to our overnight stop. The following morning we visit the Great Zimbabwe Monuments. These well preserved ruins are some of the oldest and largest stone structures in Southern Africa and were built during the 11th to 14th centuries. We explore these ancient stone structures on an informative walk with a local guide.

### Day 4 - 5 MATOBOS NATIONAL PARK [chalet BLD]



Travelling via the city of Bulawayo we move on to the Matobos National Park and our chalets on the outskirts of the park. This afternoon we enjoy sundowners from the granite ridge overlooking the park. The following morning we visit World's View and the historical site of Cecil John Rhodes' grave. Unusual rock formations are home to an

array of ancient Bushman paintings which we visit while on our game drive and walk. This area is also home to Zimbabwe's rhino which we hope to see on our excursion in the national park.

### Day 6 - 7 HWANGE NATIONAL PARK [chalet BLD]



Named after a local Nhanzwa chief, Hwange National Park is the largest Park in Zimbabwe occupying roughly 14 650 square kilometers. Hwange is famed for its large elephant population. Our chalets are in the game management area that borders the park, and we explore the park with our local guide, on a full day game drive in an open 4WD game viewing vehicle.

### Day 8 - 9 VICTORIA FALLS [guest house B--]



We enjoy a spectacular guided walk through tropical vegetation to the very edge of the "Mosi oa Tunya" or "the smoke that thunders" - Victoria Falls. There are opportunities to white water raft on the mighty Zambezi River, bungee jump or take a "flight of angels" (own expense).

### Day 10 CHOBE NATIONAL PARK [chalet BLD]



Entering Botswana, we head to the town of Kasane and our accommodation on the banks of the Chobe River. The river flows lazily along the northern boundary of the Chobe National Park attracting some of the largest herds of elephant in Africa. A highlight of any trip to the Chobe is the afternoon game viewing cruise where we hope to see large herds of elephants and other wildlife as they quench their thirst at the end of the day.

### Day 11 NATA [tented lodge BL-]



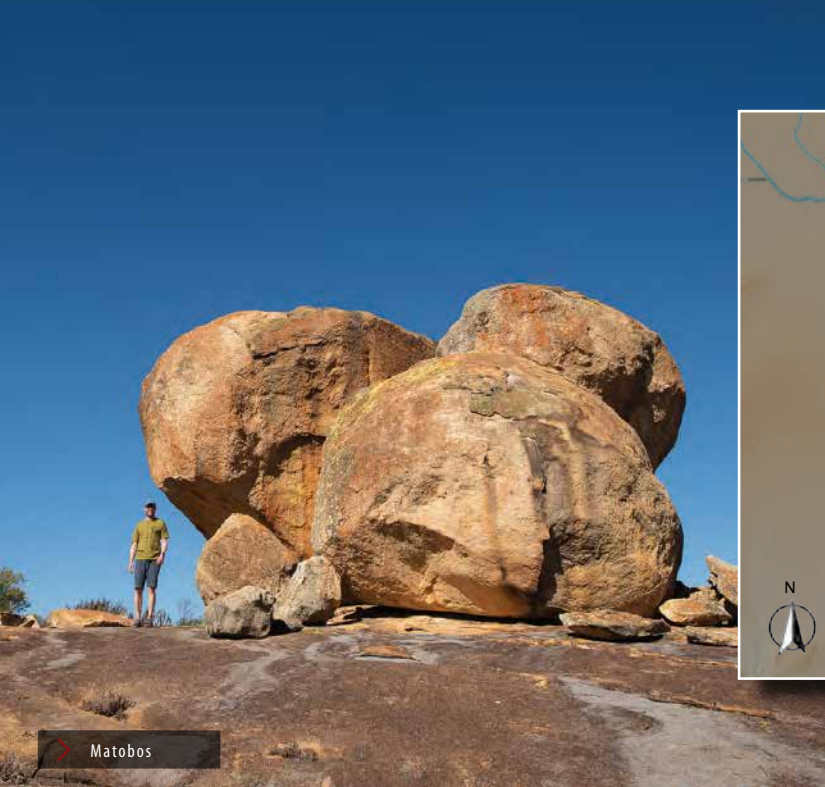
This morning we venture into the Chobe National Park in an open 4WD in search of big cats and elephants. Thereafter we head south through the Kasane Forest Reserve to the Nata area for our overnight stop.

**Day 12 - 14 OKAVANGO DELTA**

The delta forms as rain water from the Angolan highlands flows out over the flat Kalahari Desert sands, forming a delicate, green oasis for birds and wildlife. Our camp is on a remote island in this amazingly dynamic environment and we enjoy bush walks, bird watching and swimming in the clear waters. Camping with our local guides we learn more about their lifestyle and culture. Returning to Maun in the afternoon of day 14 there is time for an optional scenic flight over the Okavango (own expense).



You can end this tour in Maun on day 15 at 08:00am after breakfast to catch flights out of Maun. Thus avoid two long travel days back to Johannesburg.

As we approach Goo-Moremi the Tswapong Hills rise above the horizon. Here endangered Cape Vultures nest on the gorge cliffs above the ancestral waterfalls in the protected conservation area of Goo-Moremi Gorge. Time permitting we take an afternoon guided walk to stretch our legs.



**Day 16 JOHANNESBURG – TOUR ENDS [- B--]**

Crossing back into South Africa, we make our way to Johannesburg where the tour ends at +/- 18:00.

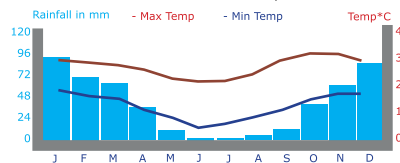

 **Meals** 13 breakfasts, 14 lunches and 10 dinners are included. Of which 9 breakfasts & 8 dinners are provided by the lodges. The remaining included meals are provided by the Sunway crew, prepared at the vehicle and eaten around the boma or campfire.


 **Transport** we use custom-built Sunway Safari trucks with 12 forward facing seats. These vehicles are comfortable for cruising with large sliding windows and front hatches giving everyone a good view; or (on 10% of tours) Mercedes Sprinter minibuses with 12 seats and air conditioning (with a trailer for equipment and gear).

**Limited participation** An essential part of your safari is some participation. From carrying your own bag to your room and day packs and water bottles on hikes, to packing the truck in the morning – it's all part of your adventure. Where the tour leaders provide meals we ask that clients help (on rotation) with the washing up. ### Day 1 - 2 MPUMALANGA [chalet Bx1LD]

**(B=breakfast, L=lunch, D=dinner)**  
We depart Johannesburg and head east to Mpumalanga. During the afternoon we visit the gold mining town of Pilgrims Rest, and the viewpoint over God's Window. Stretch our legs on a short walk from Mac Mac Pools and then make our way to our chalets on the edge of the escarpment. 

We are up early the next morning for our first long walk at the Blyde River. We walk from the rim of the escarpment down into the canyon with views over the Three Sisters and the river below, before making our way back up the escarpment again. After lunch we spend the afternoon exploring the forests and waterfalls which make Mpumalanga a beautiful destination. An exciting optional activity is the Graskop Gorge Lift, which lowers you down for a walk through the lush Afromontane forest below (own expense). 


### Day 3 - 4 KRUGER PRIVATE GAME RESERVE [chalet BLD]

An early breakfast and we make our way to Kruger National Park. We enter the national park and spend the day on an exciting game drive. Your guide will interpret the signs of bush as we hope to see elephants, rhino and possibly the elusive leopard. We stop for a picnic lunch before completing our game drive in the late afternoon as we exit the park and make our way to our private game lodge in the Greater Kruger area.

The following day we have a pre-dawn start, entering Kruger National Park in the hopes of catching the early day light game viewing. Returning to the lodge in the afternoon we venture out on a short bush walk, learning the tracks and other signs of the wildlife we hope to find on foot. 


### Day 5 - 6 KINGDOM OF SWAZILAND [chalet BLD]

We enter the Kingdom of Swaziland/ eSwatini and travel through a lush fruit farming area before heading into the mountains. We spend 2 nights


on the outskirts of Malalotja Nature Reserve with a full day to walk through this seldom explored mountainous reserve. The Swazi people have a rich cultural heritage and we will visit the craft and medicine markets on day 7 as we pass through the capital, Mbabane. 

### Day 7 - 8 ZULULAND GAME RESERVES [tented lodge BLD]

Crossing into South Africa we head towards our lodge on a private game reserve situated on the Msinene Nature Reserve. We take a walk with our local walking guide who will point out some of the 540+ bird species found in the area, and track the shy Nyala antelope in the riverine vegetation of the Msinene River.

The following morning we visit Hluhluwe Game Reserve, a key area for rhino conservation. Enjoy sunset and the sounds of the bush before a hearty dinner at the lodge. 

### Day 9 - 10 ZULULAND BATTLEFIELDS [lodge BL-]

We leave the coastline and make our way through the scenic hills and valleys of Zululand to the small town of Dundee. Here battles were fought between the Zulus, British and the Boer troops - war cries still resound in the hills. We spend time at the informative Tulana museum before we settle into our lodge and have some free time in the afternoon. 

The following morning we explore the Islandlwana battlefield before we embark on an exciting 4-5 hour hike tracing the steps of two British fugitives through the undulating hills of Zululand to the Buffalo river. Later in the day we visit Rourke's Drift before returning to the lodge.

### Day 11 - 12 DRAKENSBURG [chalet BLD]

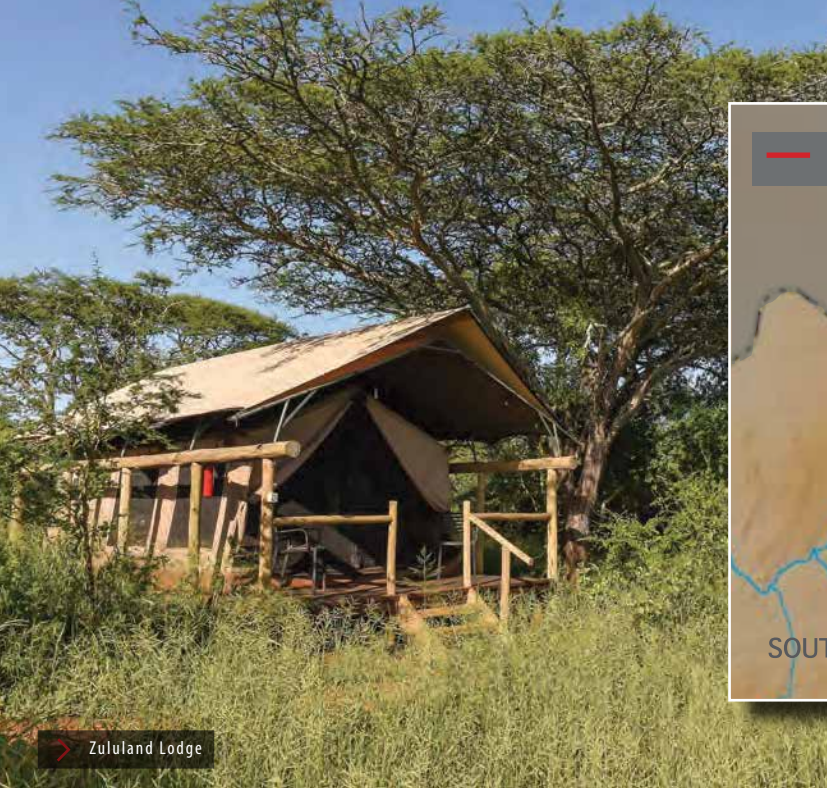
Witness the grandeur of the Drakensberg Mountains or uKhahlamba "Barrier of Spears". We overnight at the base of the "berg" (alt. 1,600m) and spend a full day walking the mountain trails before an invigorating dip in the clear mountain

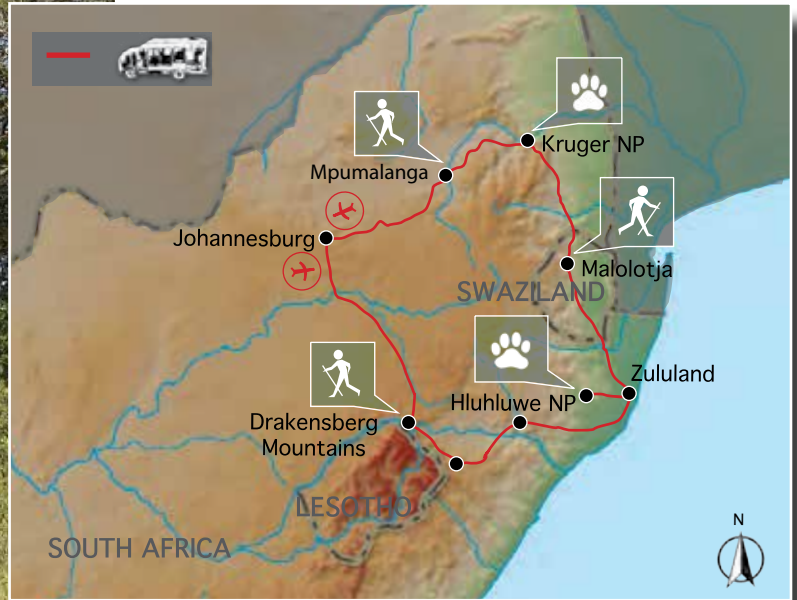

Day 13 DRAKENSBURG [chalet BL-]



We start the day with an early breakfast and make our way to Witsieshoek at the foot of the magnificent Sentinel Peak. At the end of a rough gravel road we start our trek, including a short chain ladder section, to the top of the Drakensberg Amphitheatre and the beautiful Tugela Falls (alt. 3,000m), offering unparalleled views down into KwaZulu-Natal. After our walk we make our way to the lodge perched high in the mountains (alt. 2,300m) overlooking the Mont-Aux-Sources mountain range.



Day 14 JOHANNESBURG - TOUR ENDS (- BL-)

A leisurely start to the day, with the chance to spot an endangered bearded vulture soaring overhead, before we make our way back to Johannesburg. Tour ends at +/-17:00.

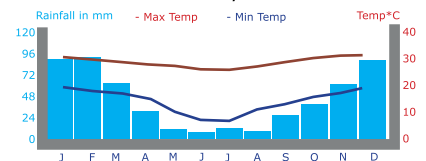

There are several long days of travel providing for a beautiful journey on the way to exciting and varied destinations.

**Limited participation** An essential part of your safari is some participation. From carrying your own bag to cleaning your window and packing the truck in the morning – it's all part of your adventure and when everyone puts in a little effort the trip will run smoothly (especially on the longer days). Where the tour leaders provide meals we ask that clients help (on rotation) with the washing up.

### Day 1 - 2 JOHANNESBURG to GREATER KRUGER [lodge Bx1 Lx2 Dx2] (B=breakfast, L=lunch, D=dinner)

Departing from Johannesburg at 06:30am we head towards Mpumalanga where mountains, panoramic passes, valleys, rivers, waterfalls & forests characterise the landscape. We enjoy the views from God's Window before descending off the escarpment and heading to our game lodge on the border of the Greater Kruger NP.

The following morning, we are up early for a full day of game viewing in Kruger National Park in our open game drive vehicle. We will return to our lodge in the late afternoon to enjoy sunset over the Drakensberg mountains, a swim in the pool and a hearty meal before falling asleep to the sounds of Africa.

### Day 3 KRUGER NATIONAL PARK [chalet BLD]

We stretch our legs on a short morning walk exploring the surrounding bush before we re-enter Kruger NP and head south. Kruger NP is the largest game reserve in South Africa, boasts the world's greatest concentration of species, and has an amazing 16 different ecosystems. Exciting game drives provide us with excellent game viewing. Spot the "Big 5" (lion, leopard, elephant, rhino and buffalo) and many other animals in this true African wilderness.

### Day 4 KINGDOM OF SWAZILAND [chalet BLD]

Malolotja Nature Reserve in the mountainous Kingdom of Swaziland / eSwatini is our next attraction. Renowned for a great variety of habitats from short grassland, to thick riverine scrub, bushveld and moist forest, we explore the reserve on foot to enjoy the fantastic mountain views. Relax around a campfire dinner and stay in mountain cabins for the night.

### Day 5 - 6 ZULULAND [tented lodge BLD]

We visit a craft market near Mbabane which has a range of handmade crafts and a local

withdoctor stall! We re-enter South Africa and head to our private game reserve located on the Msinene Reserve, where our local guide will lead us on a walk through bushveld and riverine vegetation of the Msinene River, bird watching and game tracking. Nyala, hippo and the elusive leopard are all found on the reserve. The next day we take a game drive in Hluhluwe Game Reserve, which is a safe haven for the embattled rhino. Relax in the late afternoon with a cold drink while enjoying the views over the reserve from the lodge.

### Day 7 - 8 DRAKENSBURG MOUNTAINS [chalet BLD]

The Drakensberg Mountains or "uKhahlamba" - the Barrier of Spears, is a 200-kilometre-long mountainous wonderland and world heritage site. From Zululand we move further south to the base of these mountains where we overnigh for two nights in quaint cottages. We will spend time walking along beautiful mountain stream paths, or just enjoying the spectacular views. En-route to the Drakensberg we visit the Nelson Mandela capture site museum and pay our respects to this great man.

### Day 9 - 10 WILD COAST [chalet BLD]

The Wild Coast remains a relatively untouched paradise with unspoilt stretches of dramatically beautiful coastline, open spaces and pristine forest areas. We stay overnight in Chintsa and the next day is free to explore the area, meet local villagers or go down to the beach.

### Day 11 ADDO ELEPHANT NP [chalet B-D]

The Addo Elephant National Park was established in 1931 to protect the last 11 wild elephants from extermination. Today more than 600 elephants roam through the area. The park also offers excellent viewing of black rhino, Cape buffalo, lion and leopard, as well as a host of other large and small mammals and over 400 species of birds in the greater park area.

**Day 12 - 13 TSITSIKAMMA / PLETTENBERG BAY [hotel Bx2 Lx1 -]**

The Tsitsikamma National Park incorporates 80km of spectacular sea and landscapes; a remote mountainous region with secluded valleys, coastal forests with deep river gorges leading down to the sea. We visit the Storms River mouth where there are walks up the gorge and along the rocky coast. We will stay 2 nights in Plettenberg Bay in the heart of the Garden Route. On our way into Cape Town, we visit Stellenbosch, South Africa's renowned wine region, for wine tasting (own expense) and a cellar tour. The "mother city" has many attractions; we will visit the harbour at Hout Bay, visit Cape Point, enjoy the famous beaches and the V&A Waterfront. Optional visit to Robben Island (own expense). 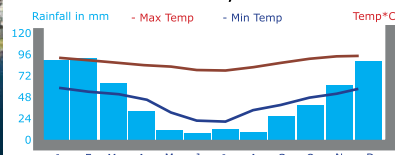

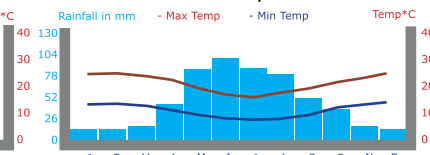

Cape Town is one of the most picturesque cities in the world, with the majestic Table Mountain providing its central focus. After a tour briefing at 8:00am, we visit the African Penguin colony en route to Cape Point Nature Reserve, and spend the rest of the day relaxing on Hout Bay beach. We sample some of Cape Town's culinary wonders at a local restaurant at the Victoria & Alfred Waterfront (own expense).

### Day 2 CEDERBERG [chalet BLD] (B=breakfast, L=lunch D=dinner)



The Cederberg is a massive rock wilderness with giant sandstone boulders that have been sculpted by wind and rain into bizarre and artistic shapes. We head north to the Cederberg and explore the rugged landscape on foot before relaxing in chalets for the evening.

### Day 3 GARIEP RIVER [lodge BLD]



We make our way into the more arid regions and upon entering Namibia, we stay at a lodge on the Gariiep River. Namibia's southern border river flows quietly and peacefully and the river valley is hardly affected by tourism. The riverbed is sandy, the water clean and clear. Time free for swimming and relaxing.

### Day 4 FISH RIVER CANYON [lodge BLD]



The Fish River Canyon, situated along the lower reaches of the Fish River, is one of the most impressive natural beauties in the southern part of Namibia. With its depth of up to 550 metres, the Fish River Canyon is the second largest canyon in the world. We make our way to the canyon to marvel at the sheer grandeur of the enormous canyon. Moving on, we arrive at the Quiver Tree Forest outside Keetmanshoop to enjoy the sunset over these bewitching plants.

### Day 5 - 6 NAMIB DESERT [lodge BLD]



The parched Namib Desert has endless orange dunes blown into sharp ridges by the sand-

shifting wind and at Sossusvlei they form a gateway into the Namib Desert. We will walk to Sossusvlei, explore Sesriem Canyon and from the comfort of our lodge outside the national park watch a dramatic sunset over the world's highest sand dunes. (If you prefer not to do the 4km walk to Sossusvlei there is an optional own expense 4WD transfer).

### Day 7 - 8 SWAKOPMUND [guest house Bx2 Lx1-]



Swakopmund is a popular seaside resort with a slightly nostalgic atmosphere, characterized by numerous colonial buildings. In terms of flora, both the Welwitschia Mirabilis and the Kokerboom grow on the stony plains of the Namib and many beautiful specimens surround this coastal town. Swakopmund is also the adventure activity capital of Namibia. Day free to explore the town or try dune boarding (own expense).

### Day 9 DAMARALAND [chalet BLD]



Namibia is a land of great contrasts and Damaraland demonstrates this with stark plains, dry river beds and ancient valleys leading to rocky outcrops and the soaring peaks of the Brandberg Massif Mountains. On our way north we will visit the Cape Cross seal colony where thousands of Cape fur seals come ashore to rest and have their pups.

### Day 10 - 11 ETOSHA NP [guest lodge BLD]



Once a vast lake fed by the Kunene River, the pan that is Etosha NP dried up thousands of years ago when the river waters chose a new course. Etosha is big game country. We take game drives around the huge pan to find the elephants, herds of antelope and lions around the waterholes. We stay at a lodge on the outskirts of the national park.

### Day 12 WINDHOEK [guest house BL-]



This pretty town, beautifully situated in a valley, combines the architecture of a modern city with numerous buildings in the style of the German

### Day 13 KALAHARI [chalet BLD]



Crossing into Botswana we overnight in huts in the heart of the Kalahari. We take a walk with the local Bushmen to learn fascinating bush skills.

### Day 14 - 15 OKAVANGO DELTA [lodge BLD]



The Okavango Delta is the only inland delta in the world: the annual flood of fresh water, spreads over 15000sq km of the Kalahari sand in a maze of lagoons and channels. We journey to the western floodplains of the Okavango Delta to our lodge overlooking a permanent lagoon, where we enjoy a game walk, a mokoro excursion and the amazing birdlife in this pristine wilderness area.

### Day 16 MAUN [lodge BL -]



Making our way around the Okavango we head to Maun where we have an evening meal at a local restaurant (own expense).

### Day 17 MAKGADIKGADI PANS [tented lodge or chalet BL-]



The shimmering salt pans of Makgadikgadi are the size of Switzerland and most of the time appear as a glaring, white, endless plain. When the rain comes a dramatic change takes place as the pans come to life with frantically feeding water birds and great herds of zebra, wildebeest and springbok.

### Day 18 - 19 CHOBE NATIONAL PARK [chalet BL-]



Chobe National Park is famous for large herds of elephant and buffalo. We explore the national park on a morning game drive and spend the rest of the day on the river, enjoying lunch on our cruise boat with spectacular wildlife viewing.

### Day 20 - 21 ZIMBABWE / VICTORIA FALLS [chalet Bx2 - -]



Magnificent Victoria Falls is one of the seven natural wonders of the world. David Livingstone 'discovered' the falls in 1885 and named them after his Queen. The scene he encountered was a mile-wide (1.6 km) sheer basalt fault line over which the mighty Zambezi tumbled to a depth of 100m, creating a cloud of spray. Tour ends at 08:00am at the hotel.



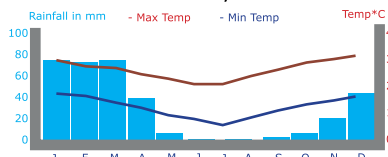

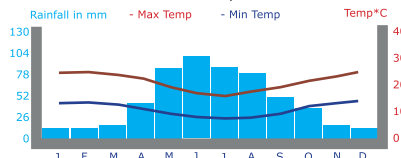

**Day 1 CAPE TOWN [hotel - - -]** 


Cape Town is one of the most picturesque cities in the world, with the majestic Table Mountain providing its central focus. After a tour briefing at 8:00am, we visit the African Penguin colony en route to Cape Point Nature Reserve, and spend the rest of the day relaxing on Hout Bay beach. We sample some of Cape Town's culinary wonders at a local restaurant at the Victoria & Alfred Waterfront (own expense).

**Day 2 CEDERBERG [chalet BLD]**   
**(B=breakfast, L=lunch D=dinner)**


The Cederberg is a massive rock wilderness with giant sandstone boulders that have been sculpted by wind and rain into bizarre and artistic shapes. We head north to the Cederberg and explore the rugged landscape on foot before relaxing in chalets for the evening.

**Day 3 GARIEP RIVER [lodge BLD]** 

We make our way into the more arid regions and upon entering Namibia, we stay at a lodge on the Gariiep River. Namibia's southern border river flows quietly and peacefully and the river valley is hardly affected by tourism. The riverbed is sandy, the water clean and clear. Time free for swimming and relaxing or you can venture down the river in canoes (own expense).


**Day 4 FISH RIVER CANYON [lodge BLD]** 

The Fish River Canyon, situated along the lower reaches of the Fish River, is one of the most impressive natural beauties in the southern part of Namibia. With its depth of up to 550 metres, the Fish River Canyon is the second largest canyon in the world. We make our way to the canyon in the afternoon to marvel at the sheer grandeur of the enormous canyon.


**Day 5 - 6 NAMIB DESERT [lodge BLD]** 

The parched Namib Desert has endless orange dunes blown into sharp ridges by the sand-shifting wind and at Sossusvlei they form a


gateway into the Namib Desert. We will walk to Sossusvlei, explore Sesriem Canyon and from the comfort of our lodge outside the national park watch a dramatic sunset over the world's highest sand dunes. (If you prefer not to do the 4km walk to Sossusvlei there is an optional own expense 4WD transfer).

**Day 7 - 8 SWAKOPMUND [guest house Bx2 Lx1-]** 

Swakopmund is a popular seaside resort with a slightly nostalgic atmosphere, characterized by numerous colonial buildings. In terms of flora, both the Welwitschia Mirabilis and the Kokerboom grow on the stony plains of the Namib and many beautiful specimens surround this coastal town. Swakopmund is also the adventure activity capital of Namibia. Day free to explore the town or try dune boarding (own expense).

**Day 9 DAMARALAND [chalet BLD]** 

Namibia is a land of great contrasts and Damaraland demonstrates this with stark plains, dry river beds and ancient valleys leading to rocky outcrops and the soaring peaks of the Brandberg Massif Mountains. On our way north we will visit the Cape Cross seal colony where thousands of Cape fur seals come ashore to rest and have their pups.

**Day 10 - 11 ETOSHA NP [guest lodge BLD]** 

Once a vast lake fed by the Kunene River, the pan that is Etosha NP dried up thousands of years ago when the river waters chose a new course. Etosha is big game country. We take game drives around the huge pan to find the elephants, herds of antelope and lions around the waterholes. We stay at a lodge on the outskirts of the national park.

**Day 12 WINDHOEK [guest house BL-]** 



This pretty town, beautifully situated in a valley, combines the architecture of a modern city with

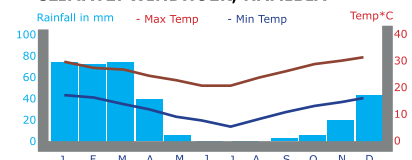

## SAFARI GRADE: ACCOMMODATED

An exciting safari experience exploring the diversity of the lesser travelled South Eastern African countries. This tour is not for the faint hearted, and requires some patience; the travelling can be slow, some nights the accommodation is basic, however the journey offers amazing scenery and fantastic highlights, well worth the long travel days. We recommend malaria prophylactics. A safari for travellers with a sense of adventure.

 **Overnight** 12 nights on safari we stay at chalets, tented lodges and guest houses, with en suite facilities. On Mumbo Island 2 of the tented rooms share a bathroom - rooms will be allocated by guides.

 3 nights camping (Sunway will provide tents, mats and chairs, but you will need to bring your own sleeping bag). Of which 1 night we "camp wild" without fences in the wilderness on an island in the Zambezi.

 **Meals** 15 breakfasts, 14 lunches and 8 dinners are included. Of which; 12 breakfasts, 1 lunch and 4 dinners are provided by the lodges. The remaining included meals are prepared by the Sunway crew, prepared at the vehicle and enjoyed around the campfire or at the truck.

 **Transport** Due to the sometimes demanding road conditions you travel in a Sunway safari truck with 12 seats or landcruiser station wagon. Potholes, speed bumps(!) & rain damaged gravel roads are characteristic of the areas we travel through and can make driving slow and bouncy. However, we pass through road side villages and thus have opportunity to witness the local lifestyle.

For the game drives in South Luangwa we use open sided 4WD vehicles with local guides.

**Limited participation** An essential part of your safari is some participation. From carrying your own bag to cleaning your window and packing the truck in the morning - it's all part of your adventure. For the longer days if everyone puts in a little effort the trip will run smoothly. Where the tour leaders provide meals we ask that clients help (on rotation) with washing up.

### Day 1 LUSAKA [lodge - - -]

The group will meet in Lusaka, in Zambia, at 16:00 at the lodge. This evening, after the tour briefing, we have a group dinner at the lodge (own expense).

### Day 2 KAFUE RIVER [lodge BL-] (B= breakfast, L= lunch, D= dinner)

We drive across the rolling Miombo forested hills of southern Zambia and down into the Zambezi Valley lowlands and our lodge on the banks of the Kafue River. Being a major tributary to the Zambezi River it is the largest and longest river lying entirely within Zambia. We overnight on its banks and enjoy the sunset from the elevated deck.

### Day 3 - 4 LOWER ZAMBEZI CANOEING [1x camping BLD, 1x lodge BL-]

We paddle down the mighty Zambezi River, home of the tribal mythical god, Nyami Nyami. Canoeing past local riverside villages and magnificent scenery. We overnight at a wild campsite on Elephant Bones Island in the heart of untamed Africa. The following morning we continue our canoe safari through an area teeming with elephants, hippos and other wildlife. We will be collected by a motorboat, and transferred back up river to our lodge.

### Day 5 LUSAKA - GREAT EAST ROAD [chalet BLD]

We head north to Lusaka the capital of Zambia where we stock up on supplies in the bustling shops and markets. Taking the Great East Road we drive this afternoon, passing small villages and street side markets, until sunset reaching the small town of Petauke.

### Day 6, 7, 8 SOUTH LUANGWA NP [chalet BL-]

Make our way down into "the valley" of the South Luangwa National Park. This remote region is one of Africa's finest wildlife sanctuaries where

elephants, hippo, lion and leopard abound. Our lodge, on the banks of the Luangwa River, overlooks the national park and you can frequently see hippos and elephants from the camp swimming pool! We explore the game management area and the national park on a game walk and open 4WD game drives, one at night with spotlights, to see nocturnal animals. (In the green season, Dec - Apr, walks may not be possible in which case we'll do extra game drives). There is time on the last afternoon either to relax in camp or take another game walk, game drive or village visit activity (own expense).

### Day 9 LILONGWE [guest house BL -]

We cross the border at Chipata into Malawi and make our way to the capital Lilongwe where we restock on supplies. The afternoon is free to wander the town or search the markets.

### Day 10 - 11 MULANJE MASSIF [lodge BLD]

We tour one of Malawi's famous tea plantations in the Thyolo region before making our way to our lodge in Mulanje. Mount Mulanje's bare rock flanks tower to almost 3002m, dwarfing all that surrounds it, and influencing cloud patterns in the area, making it an important source of rain water at the head of almost every river in this part of southern Malawi. Formed about 130 million years ago, the first European to see the Massif was David Livingstone in 1859, but archaeological investigation reveals evidence of human activity since the Stone Ages. We take a day walk on the slopes to see the streams, waterfalls and towering peaks.

### Day 12 - 13 LIWONDE [camping BLD]

Ancient baobab trees and lofty palms provide the backdrop for this magnificent southern Malawi reserve. Covering 548 km<sup>2</sup> of the upper Shire River plains and valley slopes, Liwonde harbours Malawi's largest remaining elephant population and the critically endangered Black Rhino.

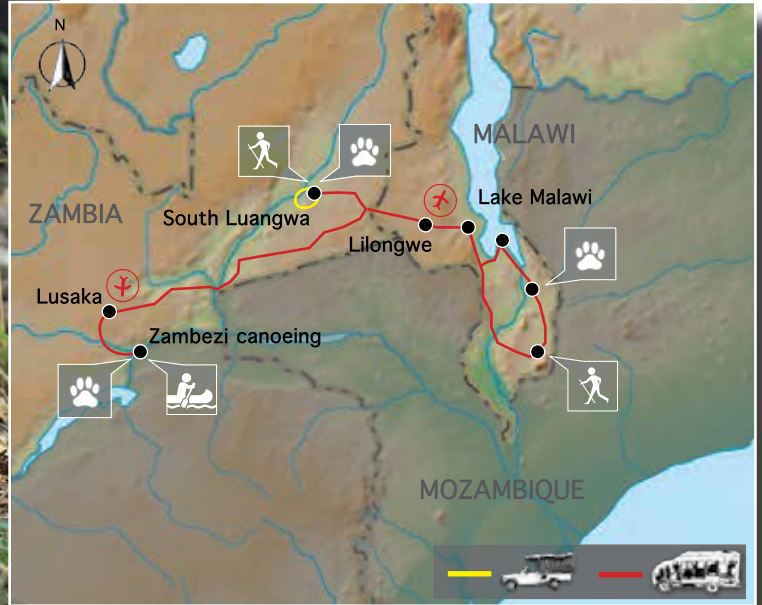

In the Luangwa Valley we stay at Wildlife Camp who donate 60% of their revenues to the Wildlife and Environmental Conservation Society of Zambia. A local guide will lead us on game walks and conduct night drives in open 4WD. Your visit will support employment opportunities.

In the morning we'll explore the grassland and woodland habitats in search of leopards, elephants, hippos, antelopes and rare Lillian's lovebirds in our safari truck.

The river Shire flows along Liwonde's western border and we'll board a river cruise safari in the hopes of finding hippo, crocodiles, elephants or any other game coming down to quench their thirst.

**Day 14 - 15 LAKE MALAWI [lodge BLD]**



Lake Malawi is the jewel of Malawi and one of the Great Rift Valley lakes. We head to the Lake Malawi National Park where we take a boat to the secluded tropical Nankoma Island, near Senga Bay. The island lodge is an idyllic paradise with kayaks and snorkelling gear available to explore the island and snorkel with the jewelled fish, the endemic Cichlids. The friendly people of Malawi make it the "warm heart of Africa".

Wake up to the sound of the birds on your own paradise island. Roll out of bed and head down to the beach to soak a morning of sun and relaxation or take a kayak for a paddle around the island. Stop to snorkel and be amazed by the sheer variety of colourful fish.

**Day 16 LILONGWE - TOUR ENDS [- B - -]**

We catch the ferry back to mainland where we climb back onto our truck and return to Lilongwe, sun-tanned, laid-back and ready to re-join life.

Tour ends at 11:00am at the Lilongwe airport.

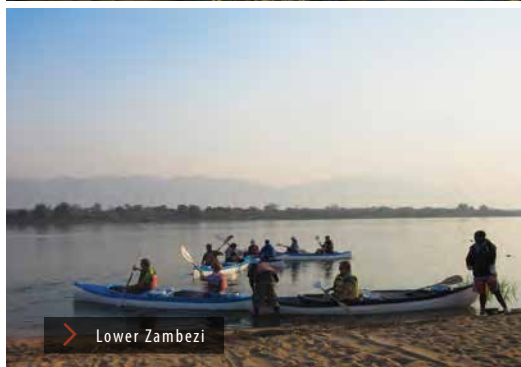

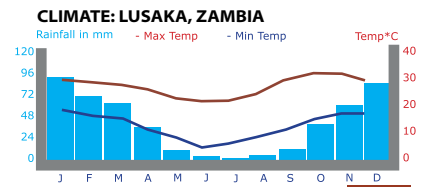
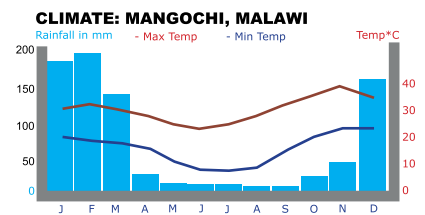

## SAFARI GRADE: ACCOMMODATED

From the culture of the Zulu nation to the Portuguese and Arab influences in food and architecture of Mozambique. Beaches, excellent diving to big game viewing and bush walks with local ranger. The accommodation in Mozambique is simple and the roads can be slow. Local facilities are limited so most of the meals are prepared by the Sunway crew. Malaria prophylactics are recommended. This is an easy paced, relaxing safari for those looking for a different experience in Southern Africa.

 **Overnight** The accommodations on this tour are chosen for their location and the activities available. 13 nights twin share en suite chalets, lodges and casitas. The guides will sort out room allocations.

 **Meals** 13 breakfasts, 13 lunches and 7 dinners are included. Of which 9 breakfasts, 2 lunches and 5 dinners are provided by the lodges. The remaining included meals are provided by the Sunway guides, prepared either at the truck or in the self catering kitchen. Meals will be eaten either under the trees near your chalet or around the campfire at the truck.

 **Transport** due to sometimes poor roads we use Sunway Safari trucks with 12 seats for this tour. On 5% of tours we may use Mercedes Sprinter minibuses with 12 forward facing seats. Potholes, rain damaged gravel roads, livestock and children on the roads can make travel slow, but at the same time you'll pass through villages and witness the local lifestyle all the way. Game viewing in the national parks will be in the Sunway vehicle.

**Limited participation** An essential part of your safari is participation. From carrying your own bag to your room to packing the truck in the morning – it's all part of your adventure. Your tour leaders will do the meal preparation when required but we do ask the clients to help (on rotation) with the washing up. There are some long travel days which means early morning starts so we all need to get involved to make the day run efficiently.

### Day 1 - 3 JOHANNESBURG to ZULULAND [tented lodge Bx2 Lx3 Dx3]

Zululand, home of the nation forged by King Shaka Zulu - stretches from the warm Indian Ocean, across the rolling green hills to the Drakensberg Mountains. We depart Johannesburg at 06:30am, travelling across the Highveld before descending into the heart of Kwazulu Natal known for its rich culture and spectacular wildlife. Our lodge for the next 3 nights is situated on a private nature reserve. We explore the natural serenity of the bush on a morning walk followed by an exciting afternoon game drive in Mkuzi Game Reserve. Mkuzi plays a key role in the preservation of the endangered black and white rhino and we look forward to watching from a hide overlooking a waterhole, as the animals quench their thirst.

On the third day we explore Hluhluwe Game Reserve in the morning with lunch at one of the picnic spots on the Hluhluwe River. Returning to the lodge in the early afternoon we have some time to enjoy the tranquility of the bush or take a swim before venturing out on a late afternoon guided bush walk.

### Day 4 KOSI BAY [chalet BL-]

Kosi Bay Nature Reserve covers a region of fertile estuaries, mangroves, dune forest and tidal lakes. This afternoon we walk down to the lake to explore this amazing eco-system by boat and the following morning we take a 4WD transfer to the Kosi estuary mouth. A special feature of the Kosi Bay estuary is the traditional practice of subsistence tidal trap fishing. We have time to swim, walk on the beach or snorkel the shallow reefs in the estuary mouth.

### Day 5 - 6 PONTA DO OURO [lodge BL-]

Ponta do Ouro is the ocean lovers mecca of Southern Mozambique. A highlight of this safari is the opportunity to join a local dolphin research team on ocean safaris. Research since the early 1990s indicates that there are approximately 400 individual dolphins moving through the Ponta

do Ouro area, of which about 150 are resident. We have 2 boat launches planned which gives us a chance to snorkel on the shallow reefs, view dolphins and whales from the boat, and hopefully swim with dolphins if their activity at the time permits us to enter the water. A wild dolphin encounter is an extraordinary wildlife experience. (Should weather prevent a boat launch then a portion of your local payment will be refunded).

### Day 7 MAPUTO [hotel BL-]

Maputo, formerly known as Lourenço Marques. Situated on a natural harbour, Maputo is the economic hub of Mozambique. Once referred to as the "African Riviera", Portuguese and African cultures meet in an exquisite blend of seafood and vibrant life. Sample the excellent seafood in a local restaurant (own expense).

### Day 8 - 9 INHAMBANE [chalets Bx2 Lx2 Dx1]

Travelling north along the Indian Ocean coastline, we drive through mango and cashew nut plantations en-route to the town of Inhambane. Arab influences are strong in Inhambane dating back to when slaves, ivory, gold and spices were traded. Explore Inhambane and its 200 year old cathedral and we visit the enchanting fresh produce market before moving to Praia de Barra. Sit back, relax and enjoy the warm sea and expansive white beaches. For the more energetic, there are optional activities such as dhow rides, scuba diving, fishing and surfing (own expense).

### Day 10 CHIZAVANE [casitas BLD]

We turn south along the coast to a secluded fishing lodge on the beach north of Xai-Xai. The lodge is perched on the coastal dunes with a magnificent view of the surrounding natural bush and expansive beach. Low tide exposes a long rocky reef parallel to the beach, which creates a shallow, calm pool ideal for snorkeling and swimming. For our last night on the beach we enjoy a fish braai (barbeque) dinner at the lodge restaurant overlooking the warm Indian Ocean.

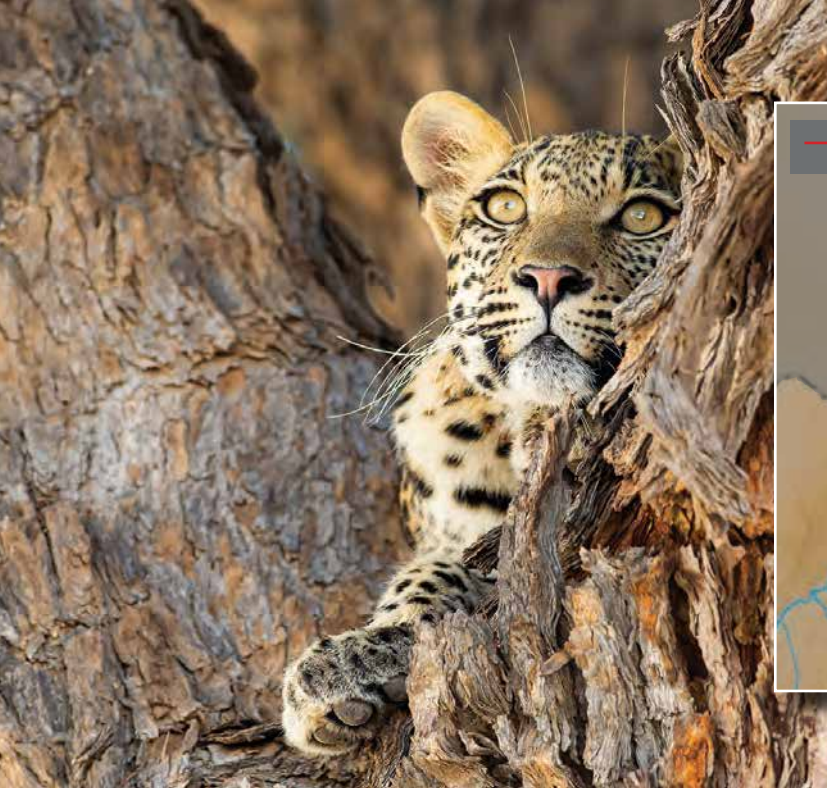

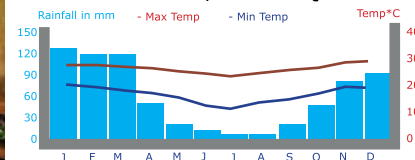

This classic journey covers Botswana, Namibia & Zimbabwe & the core of the international Kavango Zambezi (KAZA) Transfrontier Conservation Area. This initiative is a multi country effort to create a vast network of interlinking reserves and provide corridors for wildlife movement along natural migration routes, particularly for elephants.

The lodges are beautiful, comfortable & make for a great adventure safari.

 **Overnight** The accommodation throughout this classic journey is of 3+ star style and are chosen not only for their service and comfort level but also for their wonderful locations and local wildlife viewing opportunities. All rooms have private en suite facilities.

The Moremi lodge on a private concession between Chobe NP and Moremi GR is a particular highlight.

 **Meals** 14 breakfasts, 5 lunches and 8 dinners are included. All of which are provided by the lodges at which we are staying. Due to travel arrangements or game viewing activities, 3 of the lunches will be packed picnic lunches. Where meals are not included there will be an opportunity to buy a meal en route, but these are mostly travel days so a quick stop is required.

 **Transport** for the majority of this safari you travel in a Mercedes Sprinter bus with 12 forward facing seats and air conditioning; or (on 30% of tours) in a Sunway Safari truck with 12 seats.

For the game drives in Hwange, Matobos, Moremi and Chobe we use open sided 4WD vehicles with local guides.

### Day 1 VICTORIA FALLS [lodge - - -]



The majestic sight of the mighty Zambezi River plunging over the Victoria Falls, welcomes you to your Zimbabwe and Botswana adventure. We check into our lodge before we explore the falls and tropical rain forest surrounds on foot in the afternoon before heading out to a local restaurant for dinner (own expense).

### Day 2 - 3 HWANGE NATIONAL PARK [chalet Bx2, Lx1, Dx2]



Hwange National Park is a wildlife jewel, famous for its big game and large herds of elephant. Hwange is home to a wide variety of habitats, from it's western regions on the edge of the Kalahari through large grass plains to the forested woodland in east Hwange. Our comfortable lodge for two nights is situated on the private concession on the eastern boundary of the park, our time is spent on a full day game drive, in open 4WD vehicles, in the park in search of big game.

### Day 4 - 5 MATOBOS NATIONAL PARK [chalet Bx2, Lx1, Dx2]



The rounded granite boulders and undulating valleys of the Matobos National Park are home to some of the last of the rhino in Zimbabwe. We spend our day on an excursion into the park that includes a game walk to see the rhino, discovering the ancient Bushmen paintings that adorn the rocks, and admiring the landscapes from Worlds View, the site of Cecil John Rhodes' grave.

### Day 6 NATA [chalet B - -]



This morning we leave Matobos and head west towards the Botswana border, we cross at Plumtree and we make our way to the Nata area for our overnight stop. In the late afternoon we will head out onto the Makgadikgadi Pans, vast salt pans that seem to stretch on to infinity. We will explore the area and have some fun taking photographs before the golden sun sets over the horizon.

### Day 7 MAUN [hotel B - -]



Maun's name is derived from a San word meaning "place of the short reeds" is nestled at the southern end of the Okavango Delta where our lodge overlooks the beautiful Thamalakane River. Here we prepare for our trip into Moremi Game Reserve and our afternoon is free to bird watch along the river, relax around the pool or take a optional scenic flight over the Okavango Delta (own expense).

### Day 8 - 10 MOREMI GAME RESERVE [2x tented bush camp, 1x hotel Bx3, Lx3, Dx2]



Startling and unexpected contrasts are created as the waters of the Okavango flood into the drier Kalahari creating the magnificently rich wilderness area with amazing wildlife of the Moremi Game Reserve. Rivers, lagoons, savannah, woodland, Moremi offers some excellent game viewing. With over 400 species of birds, Moremi is also a great place to sight leopard, lion, wild dog, elephant, giraffe and a variety of antelope. We spend our time on game drives in Moremi GR and the surrounding concession along the Mababe River where the lagoons attract the thirsty animals to drink in the late afternoon. Our tented bush camp is on a private concession east of Moremi, where we enjoy our meals while watching the animals drinking and enjoy the wilderness far from civilization. On the morning of day 10 we have a game drive on the concession before heading back to our hotel in Maun.

### Day 11 - 12 OKAVANGO DELTA [lodge B - -]



We drive around the Okavango Delta, and north to our lodge on the banks of the Okavango Pan handle. From the lodge we'll explore the Okavango by mokoro and motor boat. Tranquil reed lined rivers, crystal clear water and abundant bird life. Time to rest, relax and enjoy the views of the Okavango Delta.

### Day 13 CAPRIVI [chalet B-D]

Crossing out of Botswana into Namibia and the Mahango Game Reserve. We game drive through the reserve to our lodge on the Kavango River. We spend our afternoon exploring on a river cruise.

### Day 14 CHOBE NATIONAL PARK [lodge B - D]

The Caprivi Strip, Zambezi Region, is a thin wedge of Namibia, which separates Botswana in the south and Angola in the north. We cross the Caprivi, back into Botswana at Ngoma and head to our lodge in the town of Kasane. The Chobe river attracts large herds of elephant as it flows lazily along the northern boundary of the Chobe National Park. See herds of elephants, large crocodiles, pods of hippo and other wildlife as they quench their thirst at the end of the day. The magnificent river sunset is a photographer's dream.

### Day 15 VICTORIA FALLS ZIMBABWE – TOUR ENDS [- B - -]

Enjoy an optional early morning game drive (own expense) before our last breakfast together. We bid a sad farewell before we embark on a road shuttle transfer to either Kasane airport in Botswana, or Victoria Falls airport in Zimbabwe, in time for midday flight departures. Our tour ends 10:00am.

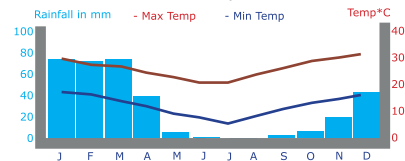

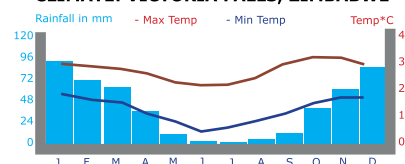

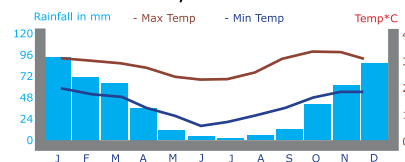

All rooms have private en suite facilities. For Etosha we stay inside the national park and for the Namib we stay on a private lodge bordering the national park.

 **Meals** 14 breakfasts, 5 lunches and 9 dinners are included. All of which are provided by the lodges at which we are staying. Due to travel arrangements or game viewing activities, the included lunches will be picnic lunches. Where meals are not included there will be an opportunity to buy a meal en route or at a restaurant in the evening.

 **Transport** for the majority of this safari you travel in a Sunway Safari truck with 12 seats; or (on 5% of tours) Mercedes Sprinter minibuses with 12 forward facing seats and air conditioning. The game drives in Etosha will be in the tour vehicle, with large sliding windows. For the game drives in Ugab and Chobe we use open sided 4WD vehicles with local guides.

### Day 1 - 2 WINDHOEK - NAMIB DESERT [lodge Bx1 - Dx2]



Meet your safari leader at 08:00am for a departure briefing. We then drive through the rolling hills south of Windhoek and drop down the escarpment onto the desert plains to stop at Solitaire for the world's best apple tart (own expense). This afternoon we travel to our lodge and enjoy the vast open spaces of the Namib Desert.

The following day we visit the Namib Naukluft National Park to witness the amazing landscapes of Sossusvlei and Deadvlei. The vleis are clay pans formed by the occasional flooding of the Tsauchab River. Sossusvlei is dotted with ancient Camel Thorn trees (Acacia erioloba) while the trees on Deadvlei are lifeless and stark against the surrounding tall orange sand dunes.

### Day 3 SWAKOPMUND [hotel B - -]



Swakopmund lies on the Atlantic coast, and the relative cool sea breezes will be a welcome change from the hot desert days. The town lies at the mouth of the Swakop River which flows infrequently, but forms the northern boundary of the relentlessly northward migrating sand dunes.

Optional scenic flights from Swakopmund offer spectacular desert landscapes as they fly along the Skeleton Coast (own expense).

### Day 4 - 5 BRANDBERG [lodge BLD]



We head inland to the Tsiseb Conservancy and the Brandberg, a mountainous granite outcrop. Standing at over 2,600m it towers above the surrounding plains and is visible from a great distance. The Tsisab Ravine at the foot of the mountain contains more than 1000 rock shelters and some 45,000 rock paintings including the famous "White Lady", which is a short 40 minute walk up the ancient watercourse. Our lodge, situated in the dry Ugab River valley, is

ideally situated to explore the area in search of the rare desert elephants and we'll join a local guide on a 4WD excursion. Being far ranging and elusive, a sighting of the elephants cannot be guaranteed, but with the knowledge of our local guide the day will be fascinating.

### Day 6 - 7 ETOSHA NATIONAL PARK [chalet B - -]



The salt pan in Etosha is the remnants of a large lake that dried up thousands of years ago. This "Great White Place" is 120km wide and forms the central attraction in the National Park. Natural springs and waterholes around the edges provide life giving water that sustains the wildlife in this otherwise arid area. Elephants coated in the white salt dust from the pan make for extraordinary photos. Our camp is located on the edge of a floodlit waterhole allowing us to get a glimpse of the nocturnal animals that come to drink, including the rare black rhino, lion and possibly leopard. We enjoy the evening sitting at the waterhole in anticipation.

### Day 8 GROOTFONTEIN [chalet B - -]



We spend most of today in the Etosha National Park, before moving to our overnight lodge in the Grootfontein district. En route we'll stop at the Hoba meteorite. At over 60 tons, it is the largest known meteorite on Earth.

### Day 9 KAVANGO RIVER [chalet / permanent lodge tent BLD]



Driving north east we enter the Kavango Region, our lodge is situated on the banks of the Kavango River, which flows from Angola, across the Caprivi and feeds the Okavango Delta. Excellent bird watching opportunities.

### Day 10 - 11 OKAVANGO DELTA [lodge BLD]



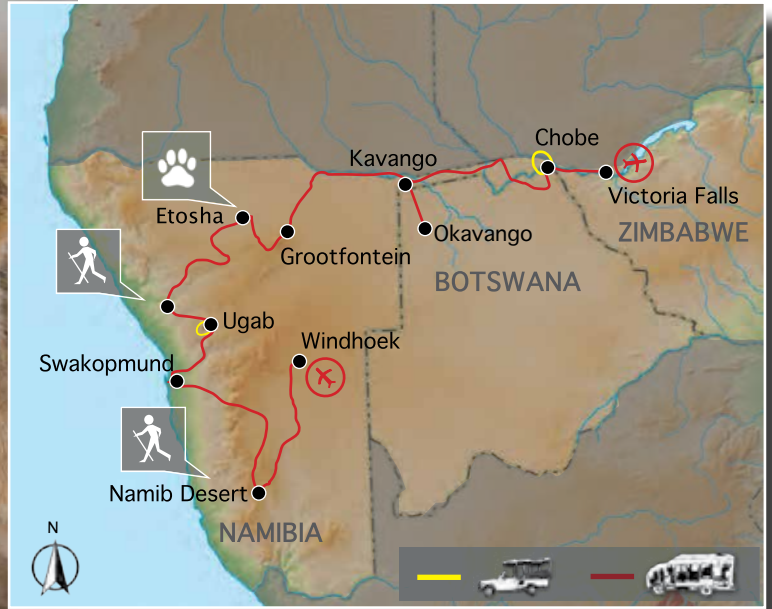
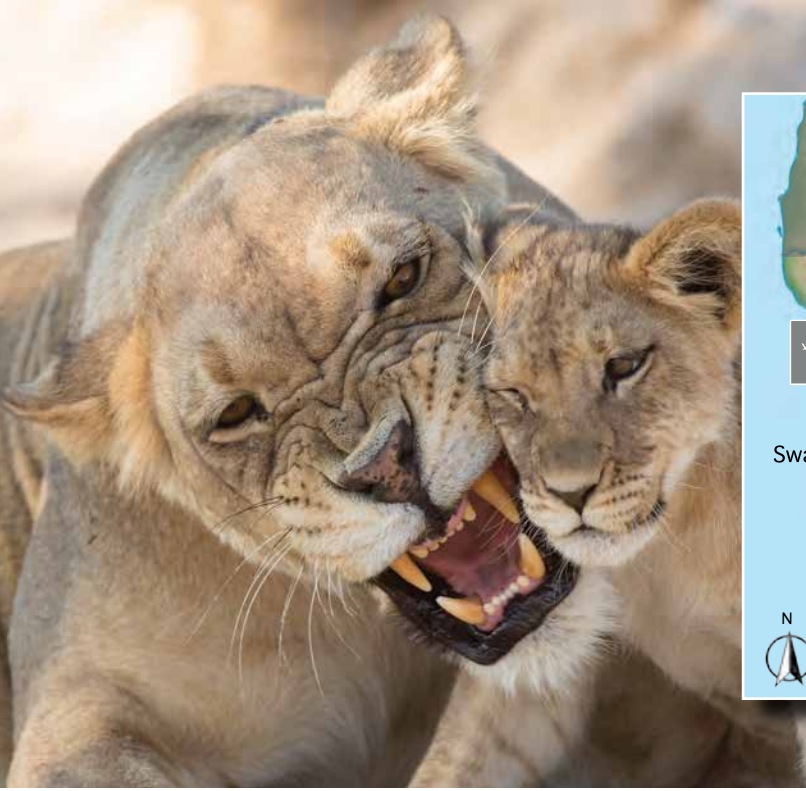

### Day 13 CHOBE [lodge B-D]



Heading east we cross the Caprivi and enter Botswana at the Ngoma Border and drive across the Chobe National Park to the small town of Kasane. The Chobe River attracts an abundance of wildlife. Our afternoon activity is an incredible experience on the Chobe River where we head out by boat into the park and get close to the elephants as they quench their thirst. We leave the park as the golden sun slips below the horizon.

### Day 14 VICTORIA FALLS, ZIMBABWE [lodge B - -]



The Zambezi River rises in Zambia before flowing through Angola and along the border of Namibia, Botswana, Zambia and Zimbabwe, before plunging 100 metres over the awe-inspiring Victoria Falls. The spray billowing up from the gorge creates a lush rainforest that surrounds the falls. With our local guides, we explore the National Park where we walk to the very edge of the falls and marvel at the power of the water that created this wonder.

### Day 15 VICTORIA FALLS, ZIMBABWE – TOUR ENDS [- B - -]

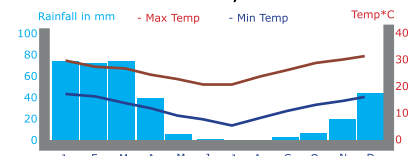

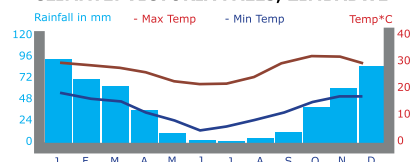

**Overnight** The accommodation throughout this classic journey is of 3+ star style and are chosen not only for their service and comfort level but also for their wonderful locations and local wildlife viewing opportunities. All rooms have private en suite facilities. For the 2 nights in central Chobe NP we stay in mini meru tents. Each tent has twin camp beds with linen and en suite chemical toilet and bucket shower with hot water off the fire.

A vast wetland paradise in the center of the Kalahari Desert, fed by rivers from Angolan highlands and seasonal rains. It is an ever changing kaleidoscope of waterways, reed beds, islands and dry land that grows and shrinks each season like a living creature itself, supporting a breathtaking range of wildlife. Hippos, elephants, lions and buffalo, the shy Sitatunga antelope and the abundant birdlife – a truly amazing wildlife experience.

We drive around the Okavango through small villages, skirting the extremes of the flood to



Etsha, where we follow thick sands tracks into the Okavango Delta panhandle. Your room overlooks a beautiful lagoon and you'll enjoy a morning mokoro excursion and a sunset motorboat cruise.

### Day 4 - 5 MOREMI / MABABE

[serviced camp – meru tents BLD]

Moremi Game Reserve is the jewel of Botswana and arguably one of the best wildlife viewing destinations in Africa. Moremi's wide variety of habitats makes it a birdwatchers paradise.

Surrounding Moremi is a vast wilderness consisting of open grasslands and forest and abundant wildlife and our camp is set on a concession bordering the east of the reserve. Our days are spent on open 4WD game drives in Moremi GR and on the wildlife concession along the Mababe River watching the abundant wildlife including elephant, hippo, buffalo, lion & other game, both in Moremi Game Reserve and in the private concession reserves adjoining the park.

### Day 6 – 7 SAVUTI

[serviced camp – meru tents BLD]



We head north from Moremi to the renowned Savuti section of the Chobe National Park. This is an excellent area for big predators with frequent sightings of lion and leopard, elephant and plains game. We spend our time on game drives through the dramatic open plains dotted with Acacia, and along the Savuti channel where we hope to see the lions and hyenas that make Savuti an outstanding wildlife destination. We overnight in our serviced tented camp. After dinner in our dining tent, fall asleep to the sounds of the African bush.

### Day 8 – 9 CHOBE NATIONAL PARK

[lodge B - -]



Our next destination is Chobe National Park. We depart Savuti and head north through the remote wilderness of Botswana to the small town of Kasane and our lodge on the banks of the Chobe River. The following day we explore the national park on a morning game drive and spend the rest of the day on the river, enjoying lunch on our cruise boat with spectacular wildlife viewing. This is possibly the most satisfying and relaxing game viewing activity in Southern Africa. We get close to the herds of elephants, and have amazing sightings of crocodile, hippo, fish eagle and many more. As the sun sets we head out of the park with some amazing wildlife and sunset photographs.

### Day 10 VICTORIA FALLS, ZIMBABWE

[lodge B - -]



We leave Botswana behind and cross into Zimbabwe and make our way to Victoria Falls. The mighty Zambezi River thunders 100m over the gorge creating a magnificent spectacle. The spray from the waterfall sustains a rainforest surrounding the falls which is abundant with birdlife and protected in a National Park. We explore the Victoria Falls on foot with a local guide bringing the Falls to life with tales of the explorers of these ancient lands.

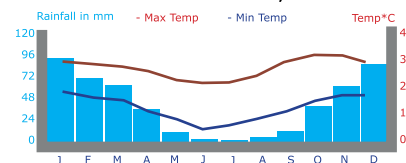

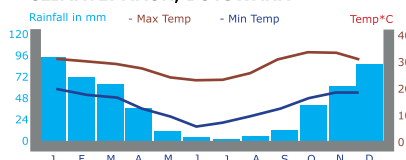

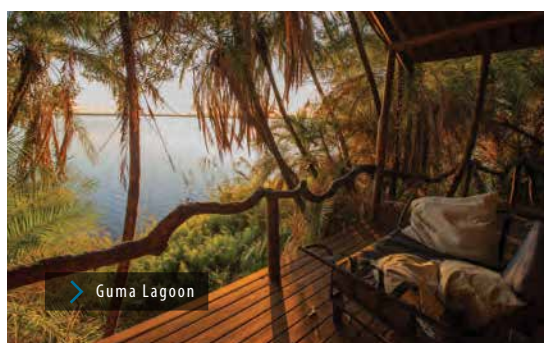

## SAFARI GRADE: CAMPING


Botswana is considered Southern Africa's premier game viewing destination. The remote wilderness, limited access for visitors and abundant game make for an exceptional wildlife safari. This tour is the essence of why we started Sunway.


The **BT14 Johannesburg start** saves you the cost of flights to Maun, and includes an opportunity to see rhino.

The **BT13 Maun start** clients join the BT14 group in Maun on day 2 and eliminates the drive from Johannesburg to Maun.

 **Overnight** 4 nights on safari we stay at designated campsites with hot & cold showers, laundry facilities & telephones. 7 nights we "camp wild" without fences in the wilderness areas. On these nights the crew will erect a bucket shower (with hot water off the fire) and a pit latrine (with seat!)

 2 nights at a lodge in Livingstone with en-suite rooms.

 **Meals** 13 breakfasts, 11 lunches and 8 dinners will be provided by the Sunway crew, prepared around the camp fire except the last 2 breakfasts at the lodge in Livingstone.

 **Transport** for the majority of this safari you travel in a custom-built 4WD Land Cruiser with 12 forward facing seats (of which 8 are "window" seats). Roll up canvas sides allow you to feel part of the bush.

For the first two days from Johannesburg to Maun we use custom-built Sunway Safari trucks with 12 forward facing seats; or (on 10% of tours) Mercedes Sprinter minibuses with 12 forward facing seats and air conditioning.

**Limited participation** An essential part of your safari is some participation. From putting up your tent to packing the truck in the morning – it's all part of your adventure and when everyone puts in a little effort the trip will run smoothly. Your tour leaders will do all the meal preparation but we do ask the clients to help (on rotation) with the washing up. If there are 9 or more clients on the tour, then a supply vehicle and camp assistant travel with the group through the national parks (days 6-11). The camp assistant will help with meal preparation and washing up, and make your life a little easier!

### Day 1 JOHANNESBURG to KHAMA RHINO SANCTUARY [camping -LD] (B=breakfast, L=lunch, D=dinner)

Departing Johannesburg at 06:30am we head north into Botswana. We pass Serowe, birthplace of Botswana's first president, Sir Seretse Khama, on our way to the Khama Rhino Sanctuary. This 4300 hectare reserve situated on the Kalahari sandveld, has several natural waterholes and provides prime habitat for white rhino, zebra and wildebeest. We take our first game drive around the open grassland of Malema and Serwe Pans.

**BT13 Maun start clients will join the group at the campsite on arrival in Maun at +/-17:00. The guides will give an introduction and tour briefing this evening.**

**Airport transfers are available on request.**

### Day 2 MAUN [camping BL-]

We drive through the Kalahari to Maun, the gateway to the Okavango Delta. Situated on the banks of the Thamalakane River, Maun is a bustling frontier town where we prepare for the delta excursion. After setting up camp we have a relaxing afternoon at the swimming pool.

### Day 3, 4, 5 OKAVANGO DELTA [camping Bx3, Lx3, Dx2]

Our local guides will take us deep into the heart of the Okavango Delta on mekoro (dugout canoes). The delta forms as water flows from the Angolan highlands out over the Botswanan flat Kalahari Desert sands creating a delicate, green oasis for birds & wildlife. We will camp wild on remote islands in this amazingly dynamic environment & enjoy bush walks, bird watching & swimming in the clear water. Camping with our local guides we learn more about their lifestyle & culture. We return to Maun in the late afternoon of day 5 and have time for an optional (own expense) game flight over the Okavango, which will reveal a different aspect of the delta.

### Day 6,7,8,9 MOREMI & SAVUTI [camping BLD]

We have 4 nights in these conservation areas with time to explore the various habitats. We spend our time on game drives watching the plentiful wildlife including wild dog, elephant, hippo, buffalo, lion & other game.

Moremi Game Reserve rates as one of the leading wildlife areas of the world and we take our open 4WD vehicle into Moremi for fantastic game viewing! Grasslands, floodplains, forests, lily lagoons and winding water channels combine to form a variety of game viewing habitats.

Moving north over the sand ridge and into the Mababe depression we arrive at the Savuti Marsh. This open grassland area attracts herds of zebra and wildebeest, which in turn draw the large lion prides for which Savuti is famous. We camp wild in the central Chobe National Park at either Savuti or Zwei-Zwei.

### Day 10 - 11 CHOBE NATIONAL PARK [camping Bx2 Lx2 Dx1]

The Chobe River flows lazily along the northern boundary of the Chobe National Park attracting some of the largest herds of elephant in Africa. In the early morning we search for game on the flood plains of the Chobe River. The late afternoon game viewing "sundowner" cruise is a highlight as we see the mighty elephant herds returning to the Chobe River to quench their thirst. We camp at Kasane on the Chobe River for night 11.

### Day 12 - 13 VICTORIA FALLS / LIVINGSTONE [Lodge Bx2--]

Overnight for 2 nights in Zambia near Livingstone town on the banks of the Zambezi River. Enjoy a spectacular walk through tropical vegetation to the very edge of the "Mosi oa Tunya" or "the smoke that thunders" - Victoria Falls.

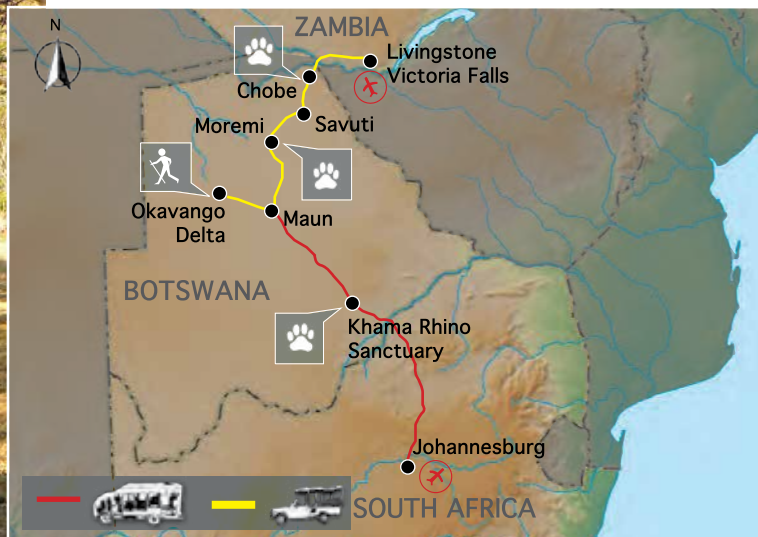

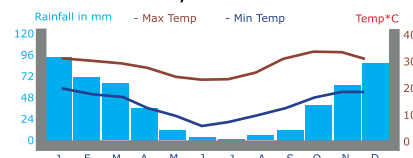

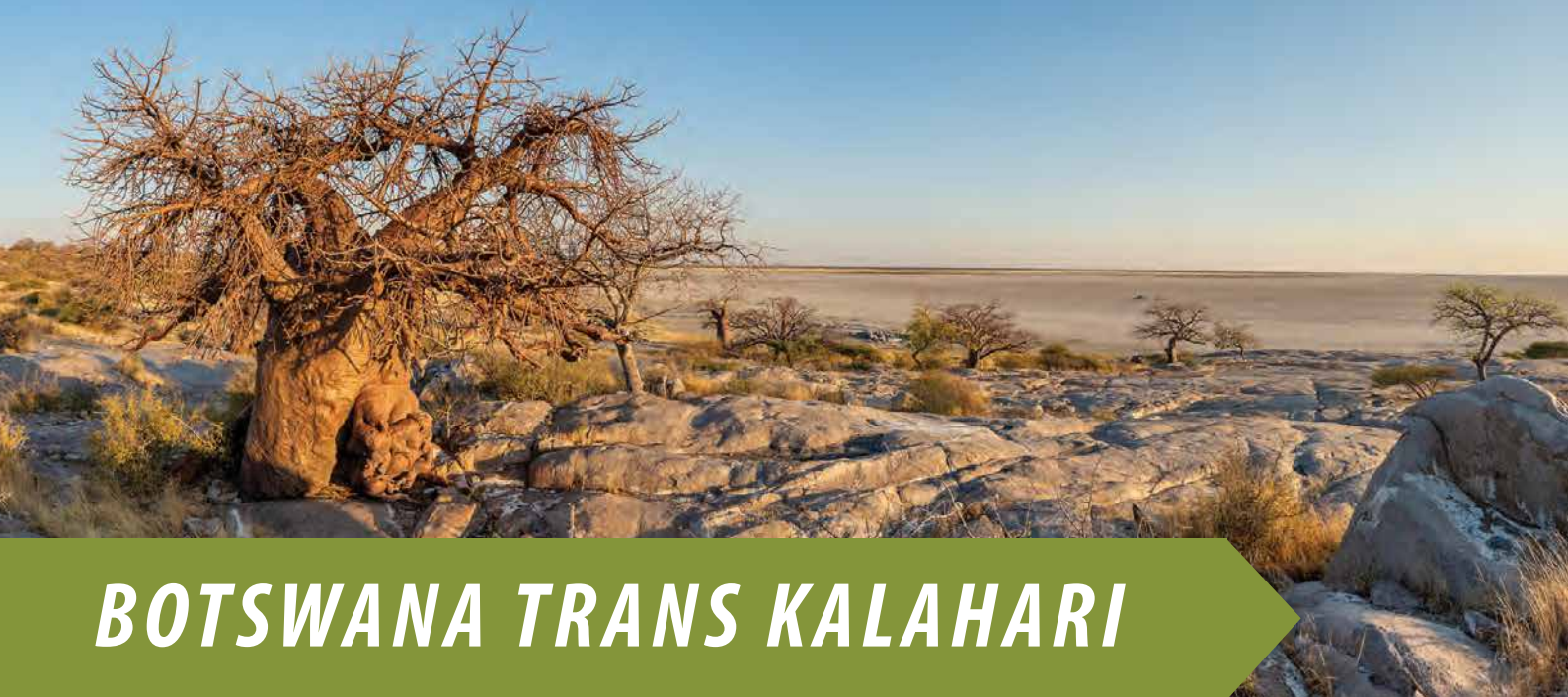

Delve into the Okavango Delta's watery wonderland, where meandering channels and lush islands teem with wildlife, inviting you to explore its intricate ecosystem. Discover the untamed beauty of the Central Kalahari Game Reserve, a vast wilderness that captivates with its stark desert scenery and the chance to encounter rare wildlife species.

**Overnight** 5 nights on safari we stay at designated campsites in national parks and towns. Formal campsites have hot and cold showers, laundry facilities & telephones. 7 nights we "camp wild" without fences in the wilderness areas. On some nights the crew will erect a bucket shower (with hot water off the fire) and a pit latrine (with seat!).

**Meals** 12 breakfasts, 11 lunches and 10 dinners will be provided by the Sunway crew, prepared at the vehicle and eaten around the campfire except for 2 dinners in Maun that will be own expense meals.

**Transport** for the majority of this safari you travel in a custom-built 4WD Land Cruiser with 12 forward-facing seats (of which 8 are "window" seats). Roll-up canvas sides allow you to feel part of the bush. For the first day from Johannesburg, and the last day back to Johannesburg we use custom-built Sunway Safari trucks or a Mercedes Sprinter minibuses with 12 forward-facing seats.

**Limited participation** An essential part of your safari is some participation. From putting up your tent to packing the truck in the morning – it's all part of your adventure and when everyone puts in a little effort the trip will run smoothly. Your tour leaders will do all the meal preparation but we do ask the clients to help (on rotation) with the washing up.

### Day 1 JOHANNESBURG – GOO-MOREMI GORGE [camping -LD]

(B=breakfast, L=lunch, D=dinner)

Departing Johannesburg we head north to Goo-Moremi campsite on day 1 of our journey, as we venture into the heart of Botswana's wilderness. We travel through breathtaking landscapes as we make our way to the enchanting Goo-Moremi campsite, where we explore the gorge, its rich cultural and spiritual heritage, its waterfalls and if lucky see vultures in the colony on foot.

### Day 2 KUBU ISLAND - MAKGADIKGADI PANS [camping BLD]

Kubu Island is a remarkable granite rock formation located in Botswana's Makgadikgadi Pans, known for its stunningly flat and desolate landscape, surrounded by a vast salt pan and characterized by its eerie beauty. After breakfast we transfer into our open 4wd safari vehicle and head off the beaten track to explore this area of baobab trees and salt pans. The flat landscape, and incredible starry skies offer incredible photo opportunities during the day and night. We explore the granite rock formations and interesting fauna and flora of the area on foot.

### Day 3 GWETA - MAKGADIKGADI PANS [camping BLD]

We skirt the edges of the vast Makgadikgadi Pans National Park, making our way up to Gweta where we spend the night at Planet Baobab Campsite. The Makgadikgadi Pans are the world's largest salt pans, covering 30,000 sq kms, formed from the remnants of a large inland lake that dried up thousands of years ago. Home to a variety of wildlife including large herds of Zebra and wildebeest and migratory birds. Enjoy an evening under the stars.

### Day 4 MAUN [camping BL -]

We have a slow morning allowing time for the optional (own expense) meerkat activity. The meerkat adventure gets us into the middle of

the comical antics of the meerkats. The meerkats live in family groups along the edge of the salt pans, and we have the opportunity to get close observing and engaging with habituated meerkats in their habitat.

We make our way towards Maun arriving mid-afternoon where we have time to resupply in preparation for our next few days in the Okavango. An optional (own expense) game flight over the Okavango, which will reveal a different aspect of the delta. We set up camp and enjoy an evening meal at a local restaurant (own expense).

### Day 5 - 7 OKAVANGO DELTA [wild camping BLD]

Our local guides will take us deep into the heart of the Okavango Delta on mekoro (dugout canoes). The delta forms as water flows from the Angolan highlands out over the Botswanan flat Kalahari Desert sands creating a delicate, green oasis for birds & wildlife. We will camp wild on remote islands in this amazingly dynamic environment & enjoy bush walks, bird watching & swimming in the clear water. Camping with our local guides we learn more about their lifestyle & culture. We return to Maun in the late afternoon of day 7 and overnight in the campsite with good, comfortable facilities.

### Day 8 - 11 CENTRAL KALAHARI GAME RESERVE [wild camping BLD]

The name 'Kalahari' conjures up images of wide-open grassy plains, dry river beds, hardy wildlife and of course the famed black-maned Kalahari Lions. You will not be disappointed! The Central Kalahari Game Reserve (CKGR) is the largest, most remotely situated reserve in Southern Africa, and the second-largest wildlife reserve in the world, encompassing 52 800 sq kms. Nothing prepares you for the immensity of this reserve or its wild, mysterious beauty. There is an impression of unending space, and having the entire reserve to yourself. We journey to the northern section of the CKGR, spending four days exploring this remote

After breakfast, we say goodbye to our Motswana guides, and beloved 4WD safari vehicles and swap over to our more comfortable minibus for the last day drive back towards civilization.

A short stop for border formalities and lunch enroute (own expense) before the tour ends in Johannesburg at the airport at 17:00 on day 13.

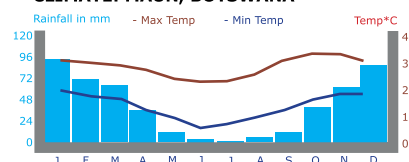

 **Overnight** 14 nights on safari we stay at designated campsites, in or bordering national parks and towns. Formal campsites have hot and cold showers, laundry facilities & shops. 2 nights "camping wild" without fences in the Okavango. On these nights the crew will erect a bucket shower (with hot water off the fire) and a pit latrine (with seat!).

 4 nights in Swakopmund, Windhoek and Kasane in guest houses and lodges with en-suite bedrooms.

 **Meals** 20 breakfasts, 17 lunches and 12 dinners will be provided by the Sunway crew, prepared at the vehicle and eaten around the camp fire or in a boma. For certain meals the group will sample the local fare at restaurants (own expense).

The group will meet in Livingstone, in Zambia, at 14:00. We have 2 days to explore Victoria Falls, a natural wonder of the world, plunging into the Zambezi Gorge. Adventure activities abound, white water rafting on the mighty Zambezi, or a 111m bungee jump (own expense).

### Day 3 - 4 CAPRIVI

[camping BLD]

Heading out of Livingstone we cross into the Caprivi, a narrow strip of Namibian land that extends between Angola, Zambia and Botswana. An abundance of large rivers attracts a variety of animals and birds and we have 2 days to explore this remote and beautiful region, including a boat cruise on the Kavango River.

### Day 5 RUNDU

[camping BLD]

After a morning enjoying the abundant birdlife that surrounds the camp, the road takes us directly west along the Kavango River. Villages of grass huts and local wooden crafts and carvings are a common sight. We stop for the night at our riverside camp in Rundu and enjoy a spectacular sunset.

### Day 6 - 7 ETOSHA NATIONAL PARK

[camping BLD]

Etosha National Park, "the great white place of dry water", in the game rich north west corner of Namibia offers a variety of wildlife. We take game drives around the huge dry pan to find the elephants, herds of antelope and lions around the waterholes before we camp at Namutoni, Halali or Okaukuejo with their flood-lit waterholes.

### Day 8 UGAB WILDERNESS

[camping BLD]

Our next stop is the Brandberg where we camp next to the dry Ugab River bed, home to the rare desert elephants. We explore the mountains on foot with

our local guides, who lead us through this region adorned with rock art including the "White Lady".

### Day 9 SPITZKOP

[camping BLD]

Our journey covers some beautiful desert landscapes as we move south towards the huge granite domes that rise out of the desert at Spitzkoppe. We set up camp at the foot of these massive domes, and take a walk to explore the area. The silence and wide open spaces add to the mystery and we enjoy a magnificent sunset.

### Day 10 - 11 SWAKOPMUND

[guest house Bx2 Lx1 -]

We cross flat open plains to the coast where we visit the Cape Cross seal colony. Further south is the coastal town of Swakopmund. Day 11 is free to explore the town or try dune boarding or sea kayaking (own expense). We enjoy evening restaurant meals (own expense).

### Day 12 - 13 NAMIB DESERT

[camping BLD]

The Lunar landscapes surround the town of Swakopmund and we visit these as we leave and head into the Namib Desert with its towering red sand dunes. We will walk to Sossusvlei, explore Sesriem Canyon and watch dramatic sunsets over the world's highest sand dunes.

### Day 14 WINDHOEK

[guest house BL-]

The charm of the city of Windhoek lies in its harmonious blend of African and European cultures and the friendliness of its people. We arrive late in the day and enjoy a restaurant meal (own expense).

**Victoria Falls to Windhoek tour ends at 08:00am on day 15 (NB15).**

Crossing into Botswana we overnight in the heart of the Kalahari. We take a walk with the local San Bushmen to learn fascinating bush skills.

### Day 16, 17, 18 OKAVANGO DELTA

We camp in Maun for a night in preparation before journeying deep into the Okavango Delta on mekoro (dugouts) - an experience not to be missed. We camp wild on remote islands for 2 nights and enjoy bush walks, swimming and the birdlife in this pristine wilderness area.

### Day 19 MAKGADIKGADI PANS

[camping BLD]

Feel the vastness of Africa under a big sky sunset. Depending on the season, the pans can either be a shimmering haze of dust or a vast shallow lake.

### Day 20 CHOBE NATIONAL PARK

[chalet BL-]



We turn north through the Chobe Forest Reserve to Kasane and our lodge. Chobe NP is famous for large herds of elephant and buffalo. Our afternoon is spent on an exciting wildlife boat cruise in the Chobe NP.

### Day 21 ZAMBIA-VICTORIA FALLS - TOUR ENDS

This morning we transfer to Livingstone where tour ends at +/- 12:00 noon at Livingstone Airport (LVI).

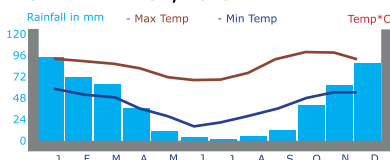

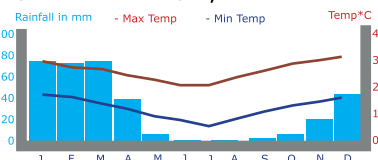

## SAFARI GRADE: CAMPING

Zimbabwe's popularity as a travel destination has bounced back in the last few years and the country offers, in combination with Kruger and Botswana, a fantastic 2 weeks of camping travel in Southern Africa. Sunway also offers this exact itinerary as an accommodated tour, see page 20.

**The ZB16 Johannesburg to Johannesburg** circular route has the advantage of simple international flight plans, and a chance to see rhinos.

**The ZB15 Johannesburg to Maun** offers you the option to fly out Maun on day 15 and avoid the long drive back to Jo'burg.

**Overnight** 13 nights on safari we stay at designated campsites, in or bordering national parks and towns. Formal campsites have hot and cold showers, laundry facilities & telephones.

2 nights "camping wild" without fences in the Okavango. On these nights the crew will erect a bucket shower (with hot water off the fire) and a pit latrine (with seat!).

**Meals** 15 breakfasts, 13 lunches and 11 dinners will be provided by the Sunway crew, prepared at the vehicle and eaten around the camp fire or in the boma.

**Transport** we use custom-built Sunway Safari trucks with 12 forward facing seats; or (on 10% of tours) Mercedes Sprinter minibuses with 12 forward facing seats and air conditioning. For the game drives in Matobos, Hwange, Chobe and the transfer into the Okavango we use open 4WD vehicles with local guides.

**Limited participation** An essential part of your safari is participation. From putting up your tent to packing the truck in the morning – it's all part of your adventure. Your tour leaders will do all the meal preparation but we do ask the clients to help (on rotation) with the washing up. Please note that although Sunway has all the correct paperwork the Beitbridge border crossing into Zimbabwe can take a long time, which can make for a particularly long day.

### Day 1 – 2 KRUGER NATIONAL PARK

[camping Bx1, Lx2, Dx2]  
(B=breakfast, L=lunch, D=dinner)

Departing Johannesburg at 06:30am we head north-east into the world famous Kruger National Park. We visit the remote and seldom visited northern part of the park from Letaba to Pafuri. We enjoy morning and afternoon game drives in our safari vehicle and hope to spot lion, elephant, rhino and other animals in this icon of wildlife conservation.

### Day 3 GREAT ZIMBABWE [camping BLD]

Entering Zimbabwe at the Beitbridge border post, we travel to the town of Masvingo and the Great Zimbabwe Monuments. The well preserved ruins are some of the oldest and largest stone structures in Southern Africa and were built during the 11th to 14th Centuries. We explore on foot and wonder at the mysteries of these ancient stone structures and the civilization that built them.

### Day 4 – 5 MATOBOS NATIONAL PARK

[camping BLD]

Moving on to Bulawayo, we arrive in the late afternoon and set up our camp on the outskirts of the park, before enjoying a sundowner and an evening around the campfire.

The following morning we head into the Matobos National Park with a local guide to visit the core of the Matopos Hills, an area of granite koppies and wooded valleys. On our open vehicle game drive we visit World's View and the historical site of Cecil John Rhodes' grave and discover the unusual rock formations characteristic of this area. As part of our visit we take a guided walk to track and hopefully find endangered white rhino, as well as other wildlife, and view bushman rock paintings.

### Day 6 -7 HWANGE NATIONAL PARK

[camping BLD]

Named after a local Nhanzwa chief, Hwange

National Park is the largest Park in Zimbabwe occupying roughly 14 650 square kilometers and is located in the north-west corner of the country. It is famed for its large elephant population. Our camp is in the game management area that borders the park, and we explore the park with our local guide, on a full day game drive in an open 4WD game viewing vehicle.

### Day 8 – 9 VICTORIA FALLS [camping B--]

We camp for 2 nights in the town of Victoria Falls. We enjoy a spectacular walk through tropical vegetation to the very edge of the "Mosi oa Tunya" or "the smoke that thunders" - Victoria Falls. There are opportunities to white water raft on the mighty Zambezi River, enjoy a boat cruise or take a "flight of angels" (own expense).

### Day 10 CHOBE NATIONAL PARK [camping BLD]

Entering Botswana, our camp is situated in the town of Kasane on the banks of the Chobe River. The river flows lazily along the northern boundary of the Chobe National Park attracting some of the largest herds of elephant in Africa. A highlight of any trip to the Chobe is the afternoon game viewing "sundowner" cruise where we hope to see a large number of elephants and other wildlife as they quench their thirst at the end of the day.

### Day 11 GWETA [camping BL -]

This morning there is time for an optional (own expense) game drive in the Chobe National Park. Heading south through the Kasane Forest Reserve we make our way to Gweta for our overnight stop. Here we sleep with our tents nestled at the base of ancient baobab trees.

### Day 12 – 14 OKAVANGO DELTA

[camping Bx3 Lx3 Dx2]

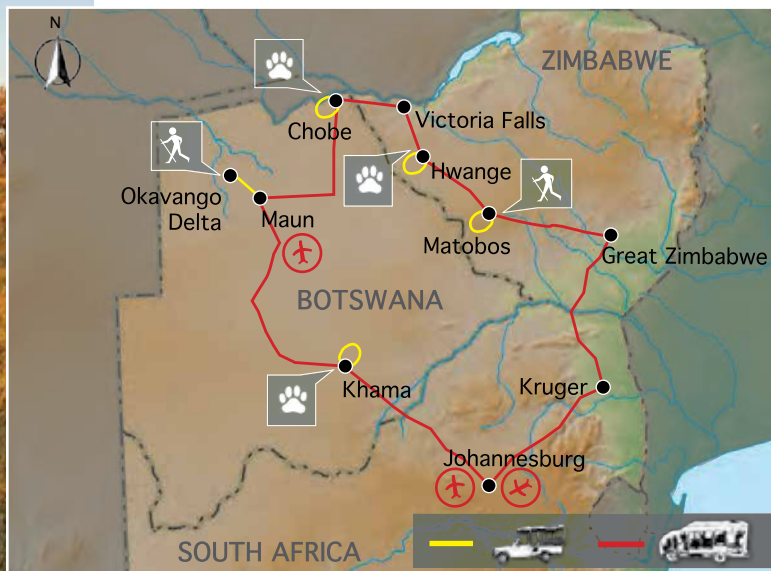
After an early start we depart for Maun where we will then transfer into the delta by an open 4WD game viewing vehicle. Our local guides will take us deep into the heart of the Okavango Delta on mekoro (dugout canoes). Being gently poled

Camping with our local guides we learn more about their lifestyle and culture. We return to Maun in the late afternoon of day 14 and have time for an optional (own expense) game flight over the Okavango, which will reveal a different aspect of the delta.

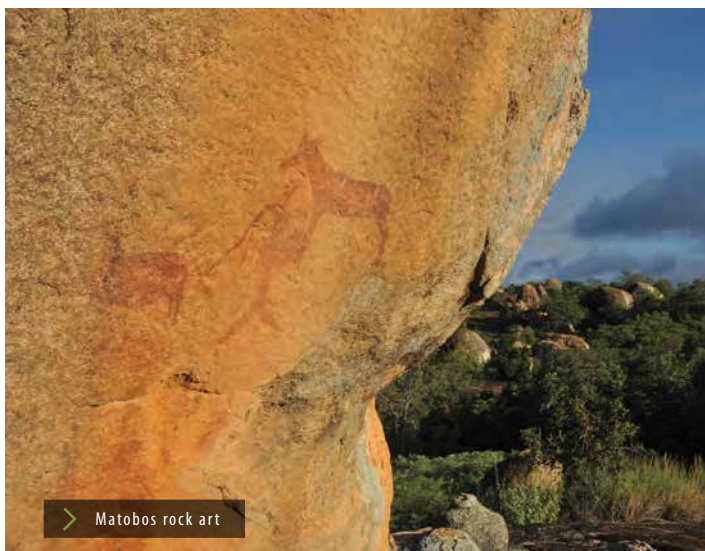
### Day 15 KHAMA RHINO SANCTUARY [camping BLD]

This is a community based wildlife project established in 1992 to assist in saving the vanishing rhino, restore an area formerly teeming with wildlife to its previous natural state and to provide economic benefits to the local Batswana community through tourism and the sustainable use of natural resources. We hope to spot some of the endangered rhino on a game drive.

### Day 16 JOHANNESBURG – TOUR ENDS [- B--]

Crossing back into South Africa, we make our way to Johannesburg where the tour ends in the late afternoon at +/- 18:00pm at the hotel.

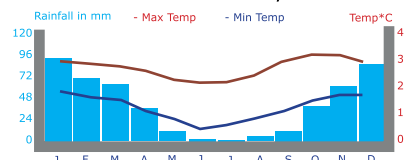

Embark on an exhilarating adventure through Zambia and Zimbabwe! Witness the awe-inspiring beauty of Victoria Falls and navigate the Lower Zambezi by canoe. Explore the abundant wildlife of Hwange National Park. Immerse yourself in history with a guided tour of the Zimbabwe Ruins. Encounter majestic wildlife on a thrilling game drive in Matobos. Traverse Nyangani Mountain on a guided walk and marvel at the stunning landscapes of Honda Valley and Chimanimani.

**Overnight** 13 nights on safari designated campsites, in national parks and towns. Campsites have hot showers. Please note there is 1 night of wild camping when canoeing on the lower Zambezi.

**Meals** 14 breakfasts, 12 lunches and 11 dinners will be provided by the Sunway crew, prepared at the vehicle and eaten around the camp fire or in the boma. 1 lunch will be provided by the lodge. 3 dinners will be own expense meals in local restaurants.

**Transport** Due to sometimes poor roads we only use Sunway Safari trucks for this tour. Potholes, damaged gravel roads and livestock on the roads can make travel slow, you'll pass through villages and witness the local lifestyle all the way. For the game drives in Hwange National Park we use open 4WD.

**Limited participation** An essential part of your safari is participation. From putting up your tent to packing the truck in the morning – it's all part of your adventure. Your tour leaders will do all the meal preparation but we do ask the clients to help (on rotation) with the washing up. There are some long travel days which means early morning starts so we all need to get involved to make the day run efficiently.

### Day 1 LIVINGSTONE / VICTORIA FALLS [camping - - -]

Our journey begins with the incredible views as the mighty Zambezi River plunges 110 meters over the Victoria Falls. We spend the afternoon exploring the mile wide waterfall and the surrounding rainforest that is created by the spray. We settle into camp in the late afternoon with the guides briefing before having dinner (own expense) at a local restaurant. Optional activity of a flight over the falls or a sunset river cruise may be possible (own expense).

### Day 2 KAFUE RIVER [camping BLD]

We pack up camp and depart Livingstone for the long drive across southern Zambia to our camp on the Kafue River. We pass small villages, and the rolling landscape offers interesting views before we drop down into the lower Zambezi River valley. We spend the late afternoon in preparation for our canoeing expedition down the lower Zambezi River.

### Day 3 - 4 LOWER ZAMBEZI CANOEING [camping BLD]

True adventure begins. This morning we pack our canoes and head out onto the Zambezi River, home of the tribal mythical god – Nyami Nyami. The river is lined with small villages and diverse scenery. For the entire day birdwatching and photographic opportunities abound. We paddle with the river current and take time to enjoy the calm and serenity. New views are offered as the river snakes its way through the valley, and the sound of the African fish eagle can be heard as it calls from the tree tops. We stop for a rest and lunch on the banks of the river before heading out again for the afternoon.

Our camp is wild on the riverbank in the heart of untamed Africa. The following morning we canoe further downstream into a wildlife rich area with opportunities of seeing hippos, elephants and other wildlife. Before we are collected by motorboat and make our way back to the starting campsite.

### Day 5 CHINHOYI [camping BL-]

We cross into Zimbabwe at the Chirundu border post and traverse the Hurungwe Safari area to our next stop at Chinhoyi Caves. Crystal clear, cobalt blue water lies at the bottom of the "pool of the fallen". The extensive system of caves and tunnels were used as a place of safety for Mashona tribesman against the Matabele raiders.

### Day 6 - 7 NYANGA NATIONAL PARK [camping BLD]

We spend two days exploring Nyanga Mountain National Park. The park offers breathtaking vistas and diverse landscapes with Mount Nyangani, Zimbabwe's highest point at 2592m above sea level. As we explore its trails, you'll encounter lush forests, cascading waterfalls, and serene lakes. The air is crisp, and the sounds of nature surround us, creating a peaceful atmosphere. The variety of ecosystems and climate in the area make it a birders haven. Interesting birdlife includes the Blue Swallows in summer and Wattled Cranes breed in the area during the winter months, and a variety of raptors.

### Day 8 - 9 CHIMANIMANI NATIONAL PARK [camping BLD]

In the morning we walk through Honda Valley before we make our way to Chimanimani National Park, where we make camp for the next two nights. The scent of wildflowers fills the air as you explore the winding trails, immersing yourself in nature's beauty.

On day 9, we embark on a full day walk in Chimanimani National Park. The park offers breathtaking landscapes and abundant wildlife. The Afro-Montane forests are home to 74 species of endemic birds, eland, bushbuck and blue duiker.

### Day 10 GREAT ZIMBABWE MONUMENTS [camping BL - ]

Dating back to the 11th century, Great Zimbabwe was the capital of the Kingdom of Zimbabwe. These are some of the oldest stone structures in

Southern Africa. The remnants of a civilization of up to 20,000 people surviving on trade in gold, cattle and crops. The word Zimbabwe means "houses of stone". The complex drystone walls and ruins leave archeological clues as to the lifestyle of the people of the area. We explore this national monument and UNESCO World Heritage Site on foot with a guided walk through the hill complex and valley ruins.

### Day 11 - 12 MATOBOS [camping BLD]

Bulawayo is our next destination and the Matobos National Park. Arriving in the late afternoon, we set up camp on the outskirts of the park. We spend the following day exploring the park.

Matobos National Parks' giant granite boulder landscapes, ancient rock art and surrounding wildlife make this a highlight of the tour. We embark on an open game drive into the reserve, where we take a guided walk to get closer to nature and hopefully track the endangered white rhino. After lunch we learn about the bushman paintings that adorn some of the rock overhangs. We visit the site of Cecil John Rhodes' grave and enjoy the magnificent sights from World's View.

We return to our camp in the late afternoon and enjoy a sundowner and evening around the campfire.

### Day 13 - 14 HWANGE NATIONAL PARK [camping BLD]

One of the most famous wildlife reserves in Southern Africa, Hwange National Park, the biggest game reserve in Zimbabwe, is our next stop. We camp on a wildlife concession bordering the park and spend the following full day in search of big game on an open vehicle game drive.

Proclaimed in 1928 this reserve forms an important conservation area along the Zimbabwe and Botswana Border. Photographic opportunities abound, as we search for the large herds of elephant, buffalo and plains game that inhabit the park. Great birdwatching with 420 species recorded in the park, and if we are lucky, we might spot some of the elusive predators. The waterholes also offer good opportunities as the wildlife comes down to drink. We stop for a rest and lunch at a picnic site in the park before enjoying the afternoons sightings. We head back to camp in the late afternoon for our last night around the campfire.

### Day 15 VICTORIA FALLS – TOUR ENDS [- B--]

On our final day we have a short transfer from our last camping site to Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe where the tour ends around lunchtime.

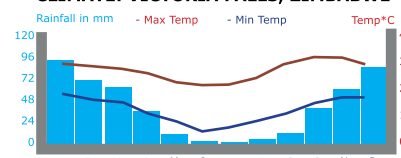

## SAFARI GRADE: CAMPING

Cape Town to Victoria Falls is one of the classic "overland" routes in Southern Africa, including the Namib Desert, Etosha NP and the Okavango Delta. The variety of highlights makes it easy to see why this is one of our most popular tours.

The **CV21 Cape Town to Victoria Falls** tour is the full 21 days.

The **CW14 Cape Town to Windhoek**, offers a complete Namibia safari, with the added bonus of a Cape Town start.

**Overnight** 14 nights on safari we stay at designated campsites in national parks and towns. Formal campsites have hot and cold showers, laundry facilities & telephones.

2 nights we "camp wild" without fences in the Okavango. On these nights the crew will erect a bucket shower (with hot water off the fire) and a pit latrine (with seat!).

4 nights guest house, twin bedrooms with en suite facilities on bed and breakfast basis.

**Meals** 20 breakfasts, 16 lunches and 12 dinners will be provided by the Sunway crew, prepared at the vehicle and eaten around the camp fire. (3 of these breakfasts are provided by the guest houses).

**Transport** Due to Namibian gravel roads we mostly run this tour in custom-built Sunway Safari trucks with 12 seats; or (on 5% of tours) Mercedes Sprinter minibuses with 12 forward facing seats and air conditioning. For the transfer into the Okavango we use a 4WD Land Cruiser with 12 forward facing seats, with trailer.

**Limited participation** An essential part of your safari is some participation. From putting up your tent to packing the truck in the morning – it's all part of your adventure. There are some long travel days which means early morning starts so we all need to get involved to make the day run efficiently. Your tour leaders will do all the meal preparation but we do ask the clients to help (on rotation) with the washing up. In the Okavango the local polers will offer to assist with washing up, and make your life a little easier!

### Day 1 CAPE TOWN [hotel ---]

Departing, after a tour briefing, from Cape Town at 08:00am we visit Hout Bay harbour en route to Cape Point Nature Reserve and then the African Penguin colony at Boulders Beach. We sample some of Cape Town's culinary wonders at a local restaurant in the Victoria & Alfred Waterfront (own expense).

### Day 2 CEDERBERG [camping BLD]

(B=breakfast, L=lunch, D=dinner)

The Cederberg is a massive rocky wilderness where giant sandstone boulders have been sculpted by wind and rain into bizarre and artistic shapes. In the afternoon we explore the rugged landscape on foot.

### Day 3 GARIEP RIVER [camping BLD]

We make our way into the more arid regions and upon entering Namibia, we camp at the Gariiep River. Free time for swimming and relaxing or you can adventure down the river in canoes (own expense).

### Day 4 FISH RIVER CANYON [camping BLD]

We make our way to Fish River Canyon, the second largest canyon in the world. In the afternoon we watch as a spectacular sunset slips over the canyon's rim.

### Day 5 - 6 NAMIB DESERT [camping BLD]

Towering red sand dunes of Sossusvlei form the gateway into the Namib Desert. We will walk to Sossusvlei, explore Sesriem Canyon and watch dramatic sunsets over the world's highest sand dunes.

### Day 7 - 8 SWAKOPMUND [guest house Bx2 Lx1 -]

Lunar landscapes surround the coastal town of



Swakopmund as we approach the coast. Day free to explore the town or try sea kayaking or dune boarding (own expense). We enjoy evening restaurant meals (own expense).

### Day 9 SPITZKOP [camping BLD]

Beautiful desert landscapes. We move north along the arid coast to the Cape Cross seal colony before heading inland to set up camp under the Spitzkoppe, huge granite domes rising out of the desert. Enjoy a magnificent sunset. We'll take a short walk to explore the area.

### Day 10 UGAB WILDERNESS [camping BLD]

Our next stop is the Brandberg where we camp next to the dry Ugab River, home to the rare desert elephants. We explore the mountains on foot with our local guides, who lead us through this region adorned with rock art.

### Day 11 - 12 ETOSHA NP [camping BLD]

Etosha National Park, "the great white place of dry water", in the game rich northwest corner of Namibia offers a variety of wildlife. We take game drives around the huge dry pan to find the elephants, herds of antelope and lions around the waterholes before we camp at Okaukuejo with its flood-lit waterhole. (Subject to animal movements we may use any of the 3 camps in Etosha.)

### Day 13 WINDHOEK [guest house BL-]

The charm of the city of Windhoek lies in its harmonious blend of African and European cultures and the friendliness of its people. We arrive late in the day and enjoy a restaurant meal (own expense).

### Day 14 KALAHARI [camping BLD]

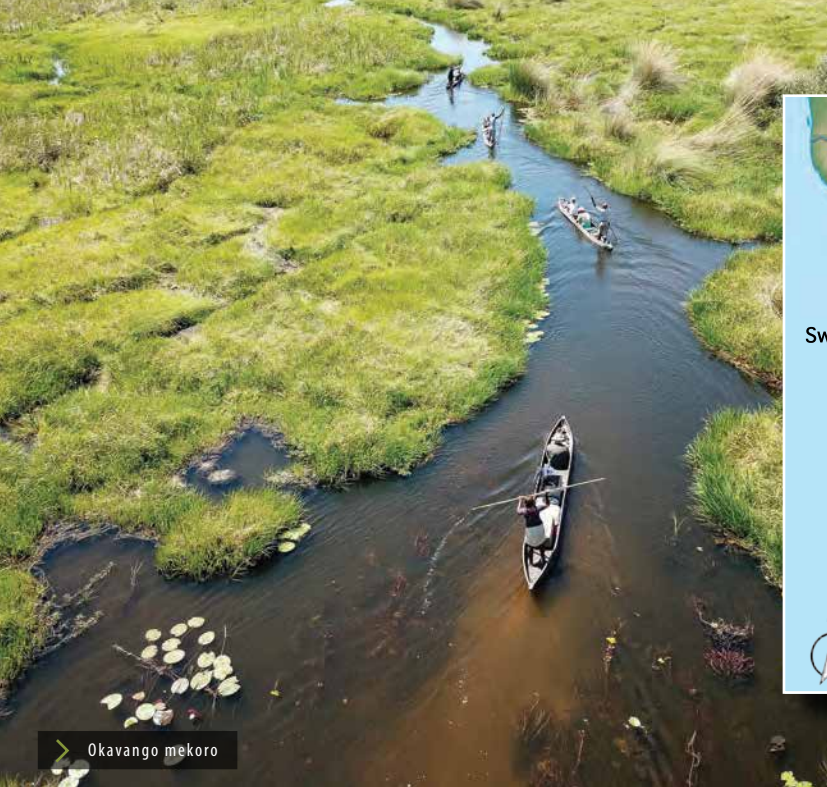
Crossing into Botswana we overnight in the heart of the Kalahari. We take a walk with the local San Bushmen to learn fascinating bush skills.

We camp in Maun for a night in preparation before journeying deep into the Okavango Delta on mekoro (dugouts) - an experience not to be missed. We camp wild on remote islands for 2 nights and enjoy bush walks, swimming and the birdlife in this pristine wilderness area.

### Day 18 MAKGADIKGADI PANS [camping BL-]

Feel the vastness of Africa under a big sky sunset. After the rains the pans fill with water and attract thousands of water birds and herds of zebra, wildebeest and springbok.

### Day 19 - 21 ZIMBABWE / VICTORIA FALLS - TOUR ENDS

[camping Bx3--]

Tour Victoria Falls, a natural wonder of the world, plunging into the Zambezi Gorge. Enjoy a sundowner river cruise on the mighty Zambezi or a spectacular "flight of angels" over the Falls (own expense). Tour ends at +/- 08:00am at the campsite.

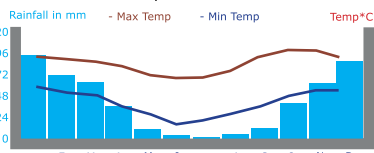

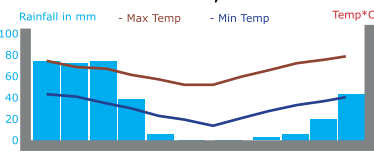

## SAFARI GRADE: CAMPING

The Trade Route is an extraordinary journey across South Eastern Africa. Active days canoeing on the Zambezi River and snorkeling in the warm Indian Ocean, game viewing in the world famous Kruger and bush walks in South Luangwa. We recommend Malaria prophylactics. Border crossings can be slow, so you need to be prepared for the experience. This journey has challenges and is for the adventurous traveller but also has magnificent highlights.

**LM22 Zambia, Malawi, Mozambique** is the full 22 day tour.

**The LL12 Zambia & Malawi** covers highlights of Zambia, with a few days on Lake Malawi, in just 12 days. Ends Lilongwe.

**Overnight** 16 nights on safari designated campsites, in national parks and towns. Campsites have hot showers. Please note there is 1 night of very basic camping with poor facilities in Tete (there is no alternative).

2 nights guest house twin bed accommodation in Vilankulos with ablutions shared between several rooms. 2 nights casitas in Inhambane, twin bedrooms with en suite facilities. 1 night in Graskop in lodge with en suite twin bedrooms, allowing you time to tidy up & pack before flying from Jo'burg on day 22.

**Meals** 21 breakfasts, 19 lunches and 16 dinners will be provided by the Sunway crew, prepared at the vehicle and eaten around the camp fire or in the boma.

**Transport** Due to poor roads we only use Sunway safari trucks or landcruiser station wagons for this tour.

Potholes, damaged gravel roads and livestock on the roads make travel slow, you'll pass villages and witness the local lifestyle. For game drives in South Luangwa we use open 4WD.

**Limited participation** An essential part of your safari is participation. From putting up your tent to packing the truck in the morning – it's all part of your adventure. Your tour leaders will do all the meal preparation but we do ask the clients to help (on rotation) with the washing up. There are some long travel days which means early morning starts so we all need to get involved to make the day run efficiently.

### Day 1 - 2 LIVINGSTONE [camping Bx1 - -] (B=breakfast, L=lunch, D=dinner)

The group will meet in Livingstone, in Zambia, at 14:00 where we have 2 days to explore Victoria Falls, a natural wonder of the world, plunging into the Zambezi Gorge. Adventure activities abound, white water rafting on the mighty Zambezi, or a 111m bungi jump (own expense).

### Day 3 KAFUE RIVER [camping BLD]

A long drive takes us across the rolling Miombo forested hills of southern Zambia to the Kafue River where we camp the night.

### Day 4 - 5 LOWER ZAMBEZI CANOEING [camping BLD]

We paddle down the mighty Zambezi River, home of the tribal mythical god – Nyami Nyami. Canoeing past local riverside villages and magnificent scenery. We camp wild on an island in the heart of untamed Africa. The following morning we continue our canoe safari through an area teeming with elephants, hippos and other wildlife. We will be collected by a motorboat, and are transferred back up river to our starting campsite.

### Day 6 LUSAKA [camping BLD]

We head to Lusaka where we stock up on supplies in the bustling shops and markets of the Zambian capital. Taking the Great East Road we drive this afternoon until sunset.

### Day 7, 8, 9 SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK [camping BLD]

Make our way down into "the valley" of the South Luangwa National Park. This remote region is one of Africa's finest wildlife sanctuaries where hippo, elephants, lion and leopard abound. We camp on the banks of the Luangwa River and explore the area on 2 game walks and 2 open 4WD game drives, one at night with spotlights, to see

nocturnal animals. (In the green season, Dec – Apr, walks may not be possible in which case we'll do extra game drives).

### Day 10 - 11 LAKE MALAWI [camping BLD]

Malawi "the warm heart of Africa". We re-stock with fresh supplies in the markets of Lilongwe before heading to our camp on the beach at Lake Malawi. We'll take a boat out to the islands to explore the fantastic bays and coves in the area.

**Livingstone to Lilongwe "Zambia Malawi" tour ends at +/- 14:00pm on day 12 at Lilongwe airport (LL12)**

### Day 12 - 13 TRANSIT MOZAMBIQUE [camping BLD]

Heading south again we enter Mozambique at Zobue border post. Making our way back over the Zambezi we travel through the Tete region, camping en route in this remote part of Mozambique. (Campsite facilities are very basic.)

### Day 14 - 15 BAZARUTO ISLANDS [chalets Bx2 Lx2 Dx1]

Upon reaching the Indian Ocean we stay overnight in Vilankulos. We take a full day to explore the Magaruque Island on a local dhow, a traditional ocean going trade vessel. Beautiful blue sea, snorkeling, expansive white beaches and some excellent seafood available – what a day!

### Day 16 - 17 INHAMBANE [casitas Bx2 Lx2 Dx1]

Arab influences are strong in Inhambane dating back to when slaves, ivory, gold and spices were traded. Explore Inhambane and its 200-year-old cathedral, before moving to our casitas (reed cabin) in Tofu. Dhow rides and scuba diving on coral reefs are available (own expense).

### Day 18 CHIZAVANE [chalet BLD]

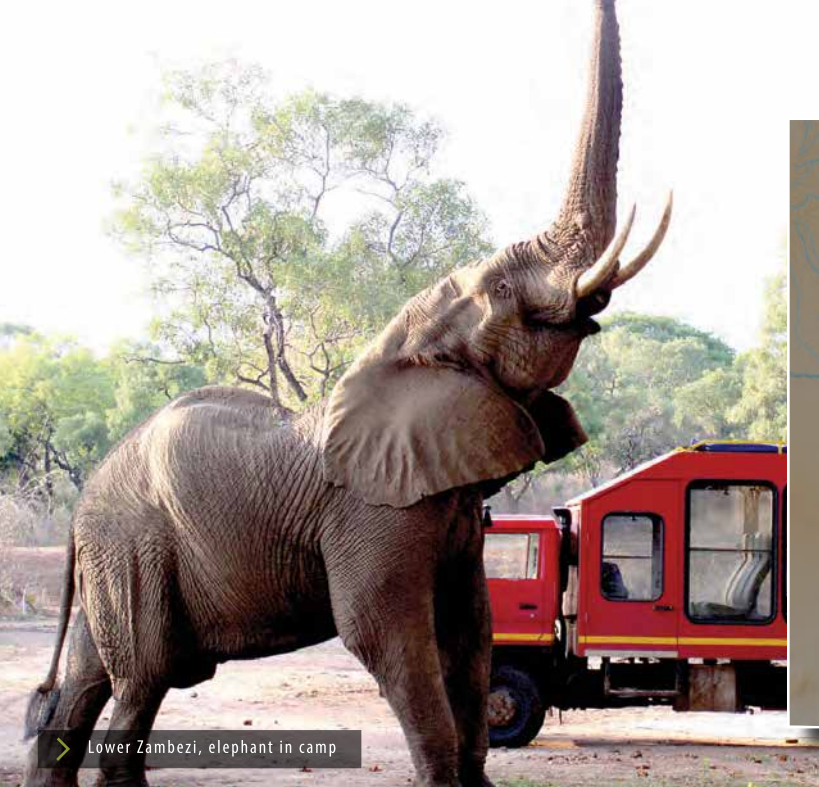
Turning south again we make our way through the

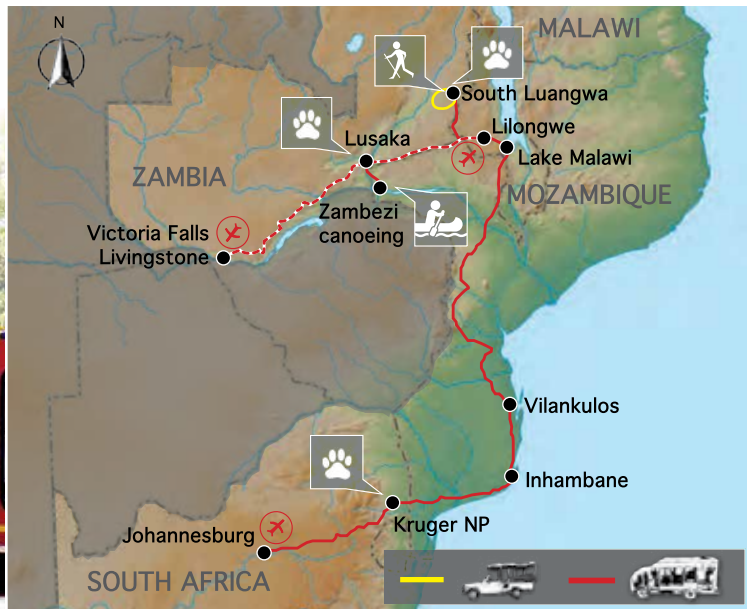

coastal dunes to our lodge on the beach at Chizavane. Just off the beach there is a shallow rocky reef which is exposed at low tide making an idyllic snorkelling spot. For those not inclined to swim, you can take a walk along the miles of remote sandy beach.

### Day 19 - 20 KRUGER NATIONAL PARK [camping BLD]

We travel through the Transfrontier Limpopo Park into Kruger National Park - visit big game country! Exciting game drives to spot lions, giraffe and the mighty elephant. Relaxing in the tranquil bush we experience a land forgotten by time, a true African wilderness.

### Day 21-22 GREATER KRUGER - JOHANNESBURG - TOUR ENDS [lodge Bx2 Lx1 Dx1]

Departing Kruger, we overnight at a private game lodge in the Greater Kruger for our final dinner under the stars. The following morning we tour the Panorama Route, visiting God's Window and the Three Sisters. We return to Johannesburg in the afternoon of the day 22, sun-tanned, laid-back and ready to rejoin life. Tour ends @ 17:00

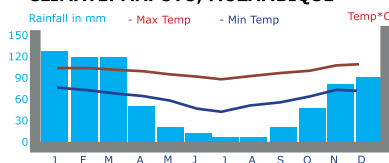

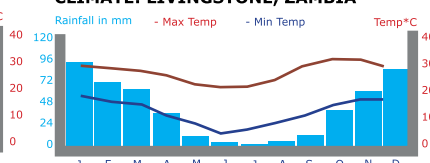

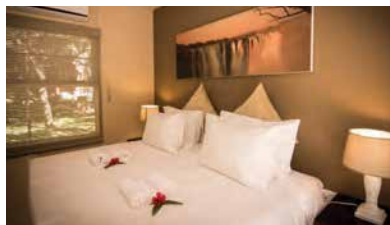
